'NOTHER NATIONAL PARK—WHY NOT?

Up at Bellingham, the Mount Baker club has laid the foundation of a movement for the creation of a Mount Baker national park, similar to the Mount Tacoma national park. A bill to this effect will be introduced at the next session of congress.

The proposal is worthy the support of the entire Sound country. While the park would be a great thing for Bellingham, it also would mean much to Tacoma and all the other cities hereabouts. It would mean another attraction for tourists to this northwestern wonderland.

With two national parks on Puget Sound, the Eastern public which loves to travel would learn all the sooner that the lure of Switzerland is no stronger than the lure of our own Cascades, once you become acquainted with them. A tourist coming to the state to visit Mount Baker would invariably include our mountain also in his itinerary. And Tacoma, of course, would share in the benefits to be derived.

A NEW CHAPTER IN SPEED

The distance from Tacoma to Portland is 142 miles. The fastest passenger trains between the two places makes it in four and one-half hours.

In the Sheepshead Bay automobile races, Anderson, the winner, made more than three times the distance in four hours and a half.

The fastest train record for 436 miles was made by the New York Central in six hours and forty-seven minutes or 64.33 miles an hour. Anderson made 102.6 miles an hour.

Not even the aeroplane has ever equalled this rate of speed for the distance.


