DARIO RESTA MAKES NEW SPEED RECORDS

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—Tearing around the new oval track at an average speed of 105.39 miles per hour, Dario Resta, the world's most sensational auto racer, yesterday afternoon broke all speed records, besides winning the 100-mile Harkness gold challenge cup race on the Sheepshead bay speedway.
Dario's time was 56:55:71. Besides taking the trophy cup, he wins \$5000. Bob Burman

finished second, two minutes behind Resta, and Eddie Rickenbacker was third. Six cars started. John Aitken was forced out of the race, after leading for the first 10 miles, by a broken connecting rod and Ralph De Palma met with similar misfortune at 40 miles. Ralph Mulford would have been second and possibly first, had he not been forced into the pit five times because of bad tires.

JESS WILLARD SIGNS TO BOX TOMMY BURNS
