ROASTS SOUND FORTS

Congressman W. E. Humphrey, speaking on preparedness before Spanish war veterans last evening at the Empress theater, said that the Pacific Northwest offers a wonderful opportunity for an invading foe and that the forts are inadequate for protection. "Our guns," he said, "could hammer away at a modern battleship and never hit it. They are outraged. The Puget Sound forts are only half-manned and the Sound could not be properly mined because of the extreme depth and currents. Besides these weaknesses, a fleet could leave Japan and arrive on our shores 10 days ahead of a fleet from the Atlantic seaboard through the Panama canal."

HEN MEN ORGANIZING

SUMNER, Nov. 12.—Washington Poultrymen will organize along lines adopted by California organizations for purpose of standardization of products and to buy supplies more cheaply. A poultry association was organized last winter by local raisers and steps will be taken to enlarge the scope of the organization. H. F. Rau of Tacoma is a leading figure in the movement.

BIG LUMBER ORDER

Tacoma lumber mills expect to share in a 7,000,000-foot lumber order awarded W. B. Grace & Co. by the government for use on the Panama canal. The greater portion of the order, amounting to nearly \$85,000, will be given to Tacoma mills, it is thought, for shipment early next month.

 NEW YORK—The Southern Pacific declared its regular quarterly dividend of two per cent on common stock here today.


SOME SCARE ON AVE
