Paul Steele declared today that he had reopened negotiations with Billy Weeks to appear in the main event of Tuesday's smoker, and that he believed an agreement would be reached. If Weeks can be signed up, he will be matched with either Ivan Miller or Romeo Hagen.

In order that there will be no disappointments through failure of boxers to show up for their matches, Manager Paul Steele of the Tacoma School of Boxing today arranged with Eddie Hunter of Seattle to attend Tuesday night's smoker as a substitute.
