BOY HIT BY AUTO MAY DIE

John Foulks, seven-year-old son of John T. Foulks of the Volunteers of America, lies in a critical, and probably dying condition at the Tacoma General Hospital today as a result of a collision between his bob-sled and an automobile at 19th and Market last night. Donald, his brother, 1 1/2 years old, is also in the hospital with a broken nose and fractured leg. The collision was with an automobile driver by A. L. Patterson, proprietor of the Commercial meat market. Patterson is under arrest, although released without bail pending the outcome of the boys' injuries. Witnesses told the police that Patterson was driving at a 20 mile rate, and that apparently he did not try to stop when he saw the sled with its two passengers speeding down the hill toward him. One wheel of the automobile passed completely over the younger boy's body.

Mayor Opposes Selling Stoves

Mayor Fawcett will oppose Commissioner Atkins' plan for the city to sell electric stoves and heating appliances. The mayor declared today that electric cooking and heating is a luxury beyond the means of the average person. Even with the new reduced rates on domestic current, Fawcett declares that the city would be defrauding the public if it attempted to open a municipal store for electric supplies. He bases his statement on the fact that it cost him \$8 to operate an electric heater for two months in his bedroom while he was ill. "If the city began selling heaters and stoves it would find half its customers returning the devices within a couple of months," said the mayor. "It's all right for the wealthy classes but not for the common people."

POINDEXTER FOR PREPAREDNESS


WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 14.—In an extended statement on preparedness, given to a New York newspaper, Senator Poindexter asserts that while he is "not in favor of losing our head in all this war talk and growing hysterical on the subject of preparedness, I yet believe that so long as the great nations of the world, with adverse and hostile interests to ours, remain armed. It will be necessary for us also to be in a position to meet them on their own ground. Senator Poindexter advocates, "so far as possible," the manufacture of munitions by the government, and declares for a "standing army at least double the insignificant force we now maintain." He is for larger support of the national guard, and pay for that force. Also he is for military training in schools.

Although the city council aimed to increase revenue by its new license rate for moving picture houses, it learned today that the revised rates have in reality reduced the total movie tax.
