Know the Tacoma Factories! BEGIN BY READING OF SHULL-DAY'S

Know your factories! That is the theme of a little series of articles, of which this is the first. They will appear in The Times about once a week and will tell some of the interesting facts regarding typical Tacoma manufacturing institutions.

It takes just 20 minutes for a piece of bolted blue denim to enter one end of the Shull-Day Co.'s plant and leave the other a full fledged pair of Big 5 overalls.

The main building contains the pant, coat and overall factory, while the shirt department is handled in factory No. 2.

182 Machines in Room. The overall parts are then assembled and distributed among the girls in the sewing room, each girl working on a different part which is passed along to the next until the article is finished.

Shirt Plant Interesting. The shirt factory occupies the same block as the overall plant. The space occupied by the shirt factory is 40x80 and contains the same modern and up-to-date machinery, including machines which will sew a four-hole button and cut the threads in the twinkling of an eye.

The Shull-Day Co. is a \$100,000 corporation and the business done in a year approximates several hundred thousand dollars. Shipments are made to Alaska, the Hawaiian Islands, Montana, Idaho, Oregon and all sections of Washington.


