

HOW WARRING POWERS BUILT WALL OF STEEL, DIVIDING GREECE FROM WORLD



1. Allies occupy island of Corfu and Kaiser's favorite winter palace.
2. Teutonic forces massed on Greek-Serb frontier for attack on allies' base at Saloniki.
3. Allies cut rail communication with northern Greece and isolate portion of Greek army.
4. Allies' defense before Saloniki.
5. Turk forces from Gallipoli peninsula massed at Xanthi on Greek-Bulgarian frontier.
6. Greek government reported to have moved official records from Athens to Larissa.
7. New allied forces landed at Phaleron and Piraeus, near Athens.
8. Corinth, where allies have also reported to have landed troops.
9. Allied fleet tightens blockade of Greek coasts.

TROOPS PREVENT LOOTING

SAN DIEGO, Jan. 31.—As the result of the breaking of the Otay dam and of floods elsewhere in the county, it is estimated 25 were killed, the majority of them Chinese, Japanese, Italians and Mexicans. Eleven bodies have been recovered.

Troops today are guarding the Otay valley because of looting. Bands of Mexicans started looting Sunday.

The Morena, Sweetwater, Cuyamaca and the upper Otay dams are being today. Because of lack of communication and uncertainty, wild rumors were afloat Sunday. Relief funds are being raised here and large quantities of clothing and food are being shipped to the stricken district.

Detective Capt. D. O. Smith, today appointed acting chief of the Tacoma police department. Smith will continue to act as personal head of the criminal investigation department, besides acting as chief over the entire department. He is a veteran in police work.
