FRENCH REPULSE TEUTONS

PARIS, March 9.—Repeated heavy German attacks against Bethincourt have been repulsed, the Communiqué said today.

Artillery fire lasting several hours preceded the two heaviest assaults. French curtain fire from Goose hill shattered the German attempts.

The Germans attempted in vain to dislodge the French from Corbeaux woods. The French consolidated and reconquered the positions there.

Intense artillery fighting at other points was reported throughout the night. Violent assaults were frequent. Paris claimed these were completely repulsed.

Twenty Germans were captured in the Lepretre woods.

AMSTERDAM—Fire destroyed large warehouses full of merchandise last night at Muenchen, Prussia.

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U.S. AGAIN TO STATE POSITION

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 9.—A statement making clear what the position of the U. S. will be in the tangled submarine issues is now being prepared. It was learned today.

It is intended to answer the alleged official German propaganda criticizing America's course. The question of whether the kaiser's decree against armed ships justifiable as a reprisal against England is the most important problem the U. S. faces now.

Upon Secretary Lansing's answer to the German memorandum of yesterday officials believe depends not only American relations with Germany and England, but the entire future conduct of submarine warfare.

GARY MUST FACE COURT

YOUNGSTOWN, O., March 9.—"If Judge Gary doesn't come here voluntarily for trial, we will bring him," declared Prosecutor Henderson today.

Henderson expects to fix an early date for the Gary trial on a charge of conspiring to violate the anti-trust law as the result of the recent steel strikes.

SCHOOL KIDS ARE DIGGING GARDENS

G. E. Farrell of the U. S. agricultural department, spoke to more than 2,000 school children yesterday on home gardening. He explained every step from the time the seeds are planted until the crops are gathered and the produce products are put on exhibition. He urged the school board to encourage the garden work.

2 ARRESTED IN BLACKMAIL CASE

SAN FRANCISCO, March 9.—Lillian Peterson and Elsie Coats, Seattle women, said to have been involved in the alleged blackmailing scheme recently exposed, were arrested here yesterday. Mrs. Isabel Clayburg, said to be another of the women, was arrested last week in Los Angeles.

SENTENCE BOY TO ELECTRIC CHAIR

VALENTINE, Neb., March 9.—W. W. Cryderman, 16, was sentenced yesterday to die in the electric chair after his confession of shooting Mrs. Anna Layport and Mrs. Nellie Heelan and setting their bodies afire after he had saturated them with oil.

WON'T PAY FOR RANGERS' HURTS

OLYMPIA, March 9.—J. M. Wilson, assistant attorney general, wrote an opinion yesterday in which he said that forest rangers and employees of the Washington Forest Fire association did not come under the workmen's compensation act.

STORMS TOO HEAVY FOR SEA CAPTAIN

BOSTON, March 9.—Capt. Charles Pickthorn of the English steamer Clearway collapsed on the bridge of his vessel as it came into port and died a short while later. The strain from a four days' watch during a storm caused his death.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—The administration's revenue bill providing for an increase of \$200,000,000, will be rushed through congress immediately.

Trawlers mistook the cruisers for dreadnaughts. This is thought to explain the story that a German fleet had left Kiel seeking the British.
