Six Months Is Most Profitable Age at Which to Kill Hogs, Says Brown

this becomes a source of profit to the cattle department. And the hogs are charged up with it in figuring their cost of production.
The bones and offal and vegetable waste from the packing plant is charged up as food to the chicken department at 3 cents a pound—stuff which Brown would have to buy at \$40 a ton for his poultry.
Accurate tab is kept on all these transactions by the managers, the items being figured into cost just as they are in big industrial establishments.
Always Thinking.
And yet, so simply is this done, that there is scarcely a record in evidence at the farm office. The farm isn't "book heavy."
Farmer Brown never gets thinking. He doesn't know when he's had enough. Next thing he's going to try to run all the machinery on his place by artisan well power.
He's even got time to feed and protect the wild song and game birds on his place because they are valuable pest destroyers and a decided asset in his scheme of success.

WIVES BOYCOTT SUGAR

CINCINNATI, O., March 10.—The housewives have declared a boycott on sugar. The boycott was declared yesterday by the National Co-operative league and communications were sent out to all branches and women's societies urging co-operation. It is claimed the housewives use 90 per cent of the sugar consumed in the U. S., and they object to paying the out-of-the-question prices which have been reached today.

DEMANDING 8-HOUR DAY

CHICAGO, March 10.—The vote of 400,000 engineers, firemen and trainmen of U. S. railroads was overwhelmingly in favor of authorizing union leaders to negotiate with the railroads for an eight-hour day, it was announced today. The trainmen also are demanding time and a half for overtime. The demands will be presented to the railroads in a few days, and they will be given 30 days in which to answer.

ASK 'DRY' PROSECUTOR

SEATTLE, March 10.—To bring about a more rigid enforcement of the prohibition law, Mayor Gill proposed Thursday that the Anti-Saloon league appoint a special prosecutor to handle law violations, the city to make an appropriation for the prosecutor's salary. Mayor Gill outlined his views in a letter to George D. Conger, superintendent of the Anti-Saloon league.

APOLOGIZE TO AMERICAN

LONDON, March 10.—Accused in a newspaper article of betraying British military secrets gained through his intimacy with Viscount French, former commander of the British army in France, George Gordon Moore, an American, of Detroit, won a libel suit yesterday against the publishers of the Manchester Evening Chronicle. French was a witness. The publishers apologized.

WOMEN NON-PARTISANS

The state-wide campaign for non-partisanship elections called out an attack from Mrs. Clara Burleigh of Seattle last night at the first annual banquet of the Pierce County Women's Republican club in the new Y. W. C. A. quarters. She declared the general tendency of women toward non-partisanship is the greatest danger to women in politics and urged her hearers to stand by the G. O. P. Of course, attacks were made, too, on the democratic administration.

PLAN A 'MOUNTAIN DAY'

"Mountain Day" for Tacomans was the plan hit upon by the publicity tourists and conventions bureau of the new Commercial club yesterday in its campaign to advertise the mountain. On this day it is planned to take to the mountain a large number of Tacomans who have never had a close-up acquaintance with it. Another committee will arrange for a "Mount Tacoma Booklet Distribution Day."


SENDS \$30,000 TO CONSCIENCE FUND
