Ford Not Far Behind

City and state elections were in the foreground in many parts of the country yesterday and today. In Michigan's first presidential preference primary U. S. Senator Smith of Grand Rapids was leading Henry Ford of Detroit for the republican nomination only by a small majority. Woodrow Wilson was the only democratic candidate.

Democrats won a sweeping victory in Butte, Mont., by placing eight party members on the city council.

Pure drinking water was the leading issue in the Milwaukee election today. More than 100 towns in Wisconsin are voting on the "wet" and "dry" proposition.

Bitter factional fights marked the aldermanic election in Chicago today. Mayor William Hale Thompson has been fighting for control of the council.

Changes for Aviation

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 4.—The announcement of Secretary of War Baker yesterday that Lieut. Col. George O. Squier of the signal corps, recently detailed as military attaché to the American embassy in London, had been ordered to Washington for aviation duty, led to the belief today that important developments in the army aviation service are promised. It is reported that Col. Squier will succeed Lieut. Col. Samuel Reiser, as head of the service.

Promote Home Buying

Fine displays of home food products and home manufactured goods were shown today in the Woman's clubhouse in the campaign to "Promote Home Buying" conducted by the club women of the city. A committee of women from the Presidents' council and the Woman's club has charge of the exhibit, which will continue tomorrow. The campaign is the local end of a national movement to encourage home manufacture.

Ask Probe of Packers

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 4.—An inquiry into every angle of the packing industry, particularly as to price fixing and restraint of trade, was demanded today by representatives of livestock growers who appeared before the house judiciary sub-committee. "The producers and feeders want a real investigation," said the attorney for the market committee. "They do not believe that other inquiries along this line have been real."

Order 66 New Vessels

BUFFALO, N. Y., April 4.—Orders for 66 vessels for great lakes at a cost of \$27,000,000 has given shipbuilding a boom in great lake shipyards. The vessels must be delivered within two years.
