THREE HOMES GO ON ROCKS

Judge Easterday spoiled three heretofore unhappy hopes today when he ground out as many divorces in less than half an hour. Hazel M. Grimm was granted a decree when she convinced the court that G. D. Grimm had failed to provide for his wife and had spent most of his money, when he worked, playing pool. Mrs. Grimm said she had to go to her mother's home at least once a day to get a square meal. Laura Toporke was granted a divorce from Martin Toporke because hubby insisted on calling her vile names and whipping her ever so often, she said. Sena E. Wright, the third party to get a divorce, said her husband William J. Wright had all the faults to make a home unhappy. Besides being cruel, Wright drank considerable liquor, she alleged.

Use Brains In Place of Chalk

A new "marker" system, by which the thousands of school children will find their way through the intricate drills during Stadium day, has been originated this year by Supervisor Kelly. Instead of chalk lines used in previous year, a leader for each school will signal to the pupils in the Stadium their location. Supervisor Kelly calls this the "brains-instead-of-chalk" system. It will work equally as well on any playground or Stadium in the county and the children will not be forced to go through their drill in simply a mechanical manner. A rehearsal was held this afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Schools Ask Cut In Rates

Declaring that the city was unfair in charging the schools full price for sprinkling water in summer and for electric light in winter, School Director Donald McPherson and Secretary Alfred Lister appeared before the council today. The schools were recently forced by the superior court to pay \$1,200 for water used in sprinkling last season, although the sprinkling charge to individuals has been abolished. Full price on lights is charged, although other large buildings obtain a reduced rate. The council declared that it was restrained by law from granting reductions in the water bills, and that the light rate was high because electricity in the schools was used on the "peak load" of the evening. The school board's protest was referred to City Attorney Harmon and Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Phelps, for investigation and possible adjustment of rates.
