## CHIEF SALUSKIN WILL APPEAL TO WILSON FOR AID

OLYMPIA, May 31.—Saluskin, chief of the Yakima Indians, guarded and bent at the age of 92, is here today for a conference with Gov. Lister on "important business." It is so important that the happiness of his tribe, Saluskin believes, is at stake.

And if the governor should tell him that nothing can be done for him, the old chief may go on a mission to Washington, to see the "big chief" of the land.

The business is this: A council of "head men" at Olympia—the supreme court—has said that the treaty between the white men and Saluskin's father at Walla Walla in 1855 does not give the Indians a right to fish anywhere and at any time.

Accompanying the old chief are two other great chiefs of the Yakima tribe—Tonnessnute and Minanich. With them also are sub-chiefs and head men—Alec McCoy, George Tecumseh and Jason Lee.

**Plan Expedition.**  
If they meet with failure at Olympia, they plan an expedition to Washington for July.

Saluskin, although he carries a cane to assist him in walking, and although he is partly blind, is nevertheless straight as a ramrod, and walks with the dignity of a man half his age.

A single tuft of feathers in his sombrero denotes his rank above the other chiefs. But he never forgets it and never allows the others to forget it.

He aims high. And in his dealings with the white men he believes in aiming high. To him, Commissioner Darwin is not sufficiently a "big chief." Satisfied of this, the leader of the Yakimas insists on seeing Gov. Lister.

"What will you tell the governor?" asked the nephew, by request of the interviewer.

"Hoh!" grunted Saluskin, disgusted by a request to discuss weighty matters with anyone but the "big chief."

## N. Y. BOYS ALL TO BE DRILLED!

NEW YORK, May 31.—The most drastic step toward military preparedness along Swiss lines that has yet been taken in America!

That is the experts' verdict on the new military laws of New York state which have just gone into effect.

More than half a million school boys, beginning next fall, will be compelled to train weekly for military duties!

Between the ages of 8 and 19 every boy in the state, unless he is a wage earner, will be drilled in military, physical and mental exercises.

And when he reaches the age of 19 he will become at once a member of the reserve militia.

These are provisions of the Welsh-Slater bills. Under the Welsh law, every school child in the state between the ages of 8 and 16 must be given at least 20 minutes' physical training each day.

**THIS APPLIES TO GIRLS AS WELL AS BOYS!**  
The training will be based upon recommendation of the military training commission, established by the Slater bill.

The Slater bill provides that every boy in the state between 16 and 19 years of age shall receive three hours' military training per week. This will include handling a rifle, shooting and military drill.

Two weeks' training in a summer camp is an added provision for those not exempt.

It is estimated this law will soon apply to more than 30,000 boys, though for the first year the 15,000 graduating annually from the high schools and private secondary schools will be alone affected.

Comment on the new legislation varies. Labor leaders say the power to draft every male citizen into the national guard could be used to break strikes.
