Section 2. That the real property to be benefited by said improvement and which is hereby created Local Improvement District No. 1038, is described as follows:
All the lots in Blocks 2522 and 2524, Map of North Tacoma, W. T.
All of said property being in the City of Tacoma, Pierce County, Washington.
Section 3. An assessment is hereby levied upon the several lots, tracts and parcels of land in said local improvement district for the purpose of defraying the cost of said improvement, in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington and Ordinance No. 4611 of said City.

Section 4. A special fund is hereby created to be called Local Improvement Fund, District No. 1038, which shall consist in the aggregate of the several lots, tracts and parcels of land in said local improvement district for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense of said improvement. Out of said fund shall be paid the interest thereon, and the entire cost of said improvement, and no part of said fund shall be used for any other purpose.
Section 5. The Commissioner of Public Works is hereby ordered to proceed with said improvement by letting a contract for the construction of the same, after inviting bids therefor in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 4611 of said City, and make out and certify to the Council an assessment roll, charging the cost and expense of said improvement against the several lots and parcels of land in the manner provided by law.

In calling for bids the Commissioner of Public Works shall state that the contractor doing the work shall agree to accept at par the bonds issued in pursuance of this ordinance in payment of the same, and shall have no claim whatsoever against the City of Tacoma, except solely upon said bonds, the special assessment made and the fund hereby created for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense of said improvement.
Section 6. Under the provisions of Chapter 98 of the Laws of the State of Washington of 1911, and this ordinance, there shall be issued five year annual installment local improvement bonds against said district, amounting to the sum equal to the amount of said assessment remaining unpaid at the time of their issuance, but not in excess of the cost and expense of said improvement, and be in denominations of \$100.00 each, except the first numbered bond, which may be for a less sum if necessary.

Said bonds shall be issued and dated not less than thirty days after the date of their issuance, and this ordinance shall take effect when said assessment may be paid without interest, penalty or cost, as fixed by the Treasurer and Mayor, and shall have no claim whatever against the City of Tacoma, except solely upon said bonds, the special assessment made and the fund hereby created for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense of said improvement.
Section 7. The Commissioner of Public Works is hereby ordered to proceed with said improvement by letting a contract for the construction of the same, after inviting bids therefor in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 4611 of said City, and make out and certify to the Council an assessment roll, charging the cost and expense of said improvement against the several lots and parcels of land in the manner provided by law.

In calling for bids the Commissioner of Public Works shall state that the contractor doing the work shall agree to accept at par the bonds issued in pursuance of this ordinance in payment of the same, and shall have no claim whatever against the City of Tacoma, except solely upon said bonds, the special assessment made and the fund hereby created for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense of said improvement.
Section 8. Under the provisions of Chapter 98 of the Laws of the State of Washington of 1911, and this ordinance, there shall be issued five year annual installment local improvement bonds against said district, amounting to the sum equal to the amount of said assessment remaining unpaid at the time of their issuance, but not in excess of the cost and expense of said improvement, and be in denominations of \$100.00 each, except the first numbered bond, which may be for a less sum if necessary.

Said bonds shall be issued and dated not less than thirty days after the expiration of the time within which assessments may be paid without interest, penalty or cost, as fixed by the City Treasurer's notice of the assessment roll being in his hands for collection.
Section 9. An emergency clause and this ordinance shall take effect immediately after publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 4671, L. I. D. 1116
An ordinance providing for the construction of a sanitary sewer of 8-inch pipe, together with all necessary tees, wyes, risers, manholes and connections with the present sewers; creating Local Improvement District No. 1116; providing for a special fund for the payment of the cost of said improvement by special assessment against the property within said district benefited thereby; providing for the issuance of local improvement bonds; and declaring that the same shall take effect immediately after publication.
Passed May 31, 1916.
