Spokane Boy Making Great Record As a Track Runner

PEARSON'S RECORDS 100-yard dash—9 4-5 seconds, made in Spokane, May 20, 1916. 220-yard dash—22 3-5 seconds, made in Spokane, May 27, 1916, around a curve. 440-yard dash—51 seconds, made in Spokane, 1915, 1916; in Pullman, 1915.

SPOKANE, June 17.—Evan Pearson, who recently equaled the world's interscholastic record of 9 4-5 seconds for the 100-yard dash, is classed by northwest sport writers as the greatest all-time high school sprinter on the track today.

Pearson tied the world's interscholastic record for the century in a meet here on May 20. A week later, running against Washington State college stars, he hit the tape in 19 flat, winning the race handily against a big field.

This sensational student sprinter is 19 years old and stands 5 feet, 9 inches in his track shoes. He has never been beaten in the 100-yard dash by an amateur runner. He has been high point man in eight meets in the Northwest.

He has a habit of running at least four races in the meets he enters and in some he has essayed five with success. The 50-yard dash, the 100, the 220, 440 and the relay are his particular events.


