Glaciers, impassable for an army, afford flank protection on both sides for Seaward.

It is considerably nearer Seattle and San Francisco than is Pearl Harbor, the Hawaiian naval base. And its natural, inexhaustible coal supply, only 200 miles away by rail, makes it a much more important point than Pearl Harbor, government men here assert.

The navy already has a big wireless station here. During the last Japanese scare the North American Commercial Co. wanted \$300,000 for its property.

MOVIE'S COMING BLOCKED

A new and unexpected obstacle arose Thursday to prevent the big film feature, "The Birth of a Nation," from being exhibited at the Tacoma theater starting next Sunday.

The theater's license for operating motion picture exhibitions expires on Wednesday, and when agents of the playhouse appeared at the city hall Thursday they were told that Commissioner Pettit had forbidden the issuance of another license.

"A license at this time would be solely for exhibiting 'The Birth of a Nation,' and since I have already ruled that the picture is a violation of the censorship ordinance, I cannot issue a license for something which is considered illegal," explained Pettit.

It was intimated Thursday that the company handling the movie spectacle would ask for a restraining order before Friday night, prohibiting the police from interfering with the exhibition of the film, on grounds that the play does not arouse race prejudice.

In such case, one of the judges of the superior court will be asked to view the film, and decide whether or not it is dangerous to exhibit.

Seattle Dock Is Bombed

SEATTLE, Aug. 17.—Only a few hours after an incendiary attempt on pier 4 last night, a bomb, placed under the floor of pier D, the Pacific Coast Co. wharf, blew a 10-foot hole through the pier floor and wrecked a small shack in which strike-breakers had been sleeping.

Police are combing the waterfront today for suspects.

The men were awakened by special policemen after the fuse of the bomb had been lighted, and dashed out of the place just in time to save their lives.

Three pier buildings were shaken by the force of the explosion.

When the smoke was first noticed a fire alarm was turned in and fire fighters arrived soon after the explosion, quickly extinguishing the blaze.

The police could find no trace of prowlers. It is their theory that the bomb planter approached the dock from a boat and worked from the water side.

The bomb apparently was placed under the wharf floor.

Ten minutes after the first explosion there was a milder report. Police traced this to a spot near the first and found a pot of phosphorus.

Police had received word Tuesday that some sort of violence would be attempted that night and the waterfront guard had been doubled.

The total damage is little more than \$100.

'DREAM' BUSINESS IS RUINED

Chong Chin, a Chinese "dream man" from Seattle, who came to Tacoma a week ago and has done a flourishing business selling dreams at \$1 per, occupies a cell at the city jail today and may be sent back to China, as the result of his arrest Wednesday evening when city detectives discovered his unusual traffic.

Chong Chin's "dreams" consisted of a tiny dab of Oriental opium stuck to the center of an American playing card. He sold the cards for \$1, and promised that the opium was sufficient for one very fine dream, if its fumes were properly inhaled.

Trade Flourished. The Chinaman came here with two cans full of the forbidden drug. Police say.

The cans are about the size of a pepper box, and contents of a single package is valued anywhere from \$5 up to \$50, according to the law of supply and demand of the underworld.

Chong Chin rented a room in a Japanese hotel, prepared a dozen or more cards with the dream dabs, and went forth upon the Chinese-Japanese quarter of Tacoma.

His trade flourished. He sold many American playing cards with their thimble-full of dark brown poppy-juice from China, and received \$1 each time.

Detectives James Milone and Cliff Osborne shadowed Chin for three days. But the cunning Chinese outwitted the police officers by darting through hidden doors, and through secret alleys.

Catch Him at Last. Wednesday evening, however, Chong Chin thought that he had left the sleuths far behind. Meeting a white man of chafky face and twitching features, he casually handed over a dream ticket, and pocketed his dollar.

The next moment a heavy hand rested on Chin's silken blouse, and he was on his way to a police patrol.

In Chin's rooms was found one of the finest ivory-decorated Chinese opium outfits ever confiscated by the Tacoma police. Two five-tael tins, still half filled with opium, were hidden under the mattress.

The Chinese will be held on a charge of selling opium until Customs Inspector W. A. Fairweather who is investigating the case for Uncle Sam, can arrange to deport Chin on a trans-Pacific steamer. And the supply of dream-pills
