

## SEYMOUR LIFTS VEIL OF "IMPERIAL" BAND

Offering to reimburse from his own pocket any person who bought a ticket for any of the concerts of the Pelz Russian band and was dissatisfied with the recent concerts by that organization, W. W. Seymour, former mayor of Tacoma, has issued an open letter explaining some heretofore clouded facts concerning the band's appearance here. That the organization was not a Russian imperial band, but was composed of "Russian imperial" musicians from Seattle and Tacoma, is Seymour's first admission.

## FRENCH RETAKE FLEURY

LONDON, Aug. 18.—The French have recaptured Fleury, it was announced today. Curtain fire prevented the Germans from sending reinforcements. After bloody street fighting the Germans withdrew. The French advanced near Thiaumont, while the British extended their gains northwest of Bazentin-le-Petit. They found the trenches crowded with corpses. Petrograd claimed the Russians are approaching the mountain summits near Koromez, Hungary. They have captured Lysee and Stary southwest of Stanislaw.

## Papers Let Up On Gerard Attacks

BERLIN, Aug. 18.—The attacks by German newspapers on U. S. Ambassador Gerard are subsiding. The Morgenpost alone renewed the criticism today. The editor reiterated the hope that the kaiser would investigate Gerard. The ambassador asserted American correspondents might cause international trouble if they urged the government to protest against British censorship.

## HUGHES IGNORES GOV. JOHNSON, TOO

MEDFORD, Ore., Aug. 18.—Charles E. Hughes has been asked by Chester Rowell, of Fresno, Cal., member of the republican national campaign committee, to do what he can to adjust the factional fight in California between progressives and republican leaders. Gov. Hiram Johnson, progressive leader and Hughes supporter, has not been invited to attend the Hughes meeting in San Francisco.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 18.—Eminent plague experts, scientists and bacteriologists, at a conference will today adopt resolutions outlining plans to check a widespread outbreak of infantile paralysis.

## HEAD OF N. P. DEAD

NEW YORK, Aug. 18.—William F. Clough, chairman of the board of directors of the Northern Pacific, director of several other railways, and vice president of the Northern Express company, died at his home here last night.
