To Fly a Peace Kite

(United Press Leased Wire)
LONDON, Sept. 22.—Germany will set another peace kite flying about the middle of October, British officials, both military and civil, confidently expect.
Recent apparently well authenticated rumors have reached London that Germany, suffering huge losses because of the recent allied offensive, is endeavoring to suggest an armistice through Spain or the United States. It is understood on reliable authority that King Alfonso so far is unresponsive and is unlikely to act.
The Germans, it is believed here, hope to tempt President Wilson to start negotiations at the time when any attendant success would be likely to affect favorably his chances of re-election.

Educators For Wilson

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—Harry A. Garfield, president of Williams college and of James A. Garfield, martyred republican president, has not only declared his intention to support Woodrow Wilson for re-election, but has enrolled as a vice president of the Woodrow Wilson Independent League of Massachusetts.
Another distinguished vice president of the same organization is Charles W. Eliot, president emeritus of Harvard university.
Prof. Charles R. Linoley, in charge of the department of history in Dartmouth college, has also announced his intention of supporting President Wilson for re-election.

It's a Fine Regiment

Maj. Gen. J. Franklin Bell, head of the Western department of the U. S. army, offered the highest sort of praise for the 2d Washington infantry after a review of the troops at American lake Thursday.
"I have been 42 years in the service and this is the first regiment I have ever seen recruited up to full war strength," he said. "It is a fine regiment." He complimented officers and men on their excellent showing.
Bell has been inspecting the site of the business men's training camp at Fort Lawton.

Citizenship Classes

One of the biggest features of Tacoma's night schools which will open next Monday night at 7:30 will be special instruction in citizenship offered to aliens who want to become U. S. citizens. The school authorities will co-operate with the U. S. labor bureau in the work.
The classes are held in Stadium and Lincoln Park high schools. All courses will be free, except those in mechanical arts and domestic science. There will be no seasonal fee for use of the gymnasium and swimming pools.

Eat Apples, Is Slogan

NORTH YAKIMA, Sept. 22.—Governors of three northwest states, Lister of Washington, Withycombe of Oregon and Alexander of Idaho, guests at a meeting of fruit growers and shippers, have pledged their support to the movement to co-operate with the federal government in promoting the consumption of apples.
The plan to ask the legislature for money to conduct a joint advertising campaign has been suggested.

No Change in Charter

The Tacoma Rotary club has endorsed the declaration in its committee's report that the present city charter is unsatisfactory. The committee will investigate further into ways to better the form of city government. Its report advocated combining the city manager plan with that of the commission form of government.
