

**WOMAN KILLED IN STRIKE RIOT**

(United Press Leased Wire)  
 BAYONNE, N. J., Oct. 12. — One woman has been killed, four strikers perhaps fatally injured, four policemen wounded and more than 30 rioters have received bullet wounds in 36 hours in the "Hook" district, where strikers of the big Standard Oil plant rule today.  
 Chief of Police Michael Reilly declared today that last night was the worst he had put in in 20 years of handling strikes. The firemen answered 30 alarms during the night.  
 Hearing that Samuel Greenberg, a saloonkeeper, was conferring with strikebreakers, a mob stormed his place early today, broke in the doors as Greenburg, with his wife and children in their night clothes, fled to the

roof and fastened the hatch, then set fire to the building.  
 A squad of detectives charged the crowd, drove them off and brought the family down ladders as firemen put out the fire.  
 Behind their "dead line," which cuts off the lower end of Bayonne, strikers were in complete control.  
 Last night a mob of several hundred strikers held up fire apparatus going to a fire in the Lehigh Valley yards.  
 Strikers cut the hose as fast as it was unrolled.  
 The police charged and in the fight which followed Mrs. Sophie Todek, a bride of three weeks, was killed as she leaned from an upper window, two strikers were probably fatally injured and more than a score received bullet

**WHISKY IS BILLED TO SANDBERG'S RELATIVE**

The huge shipment of whisky seized by Sheriff Longmire in the raid Tuesday night near Lakeview was billed to J. C. Bratt, son-in-law of Pete Sandberg, and consigned to the Purity Drug Co., 14th and Pacific ave., of which Bratt is manager.  
 This is the latest development in the efforts of county officials to draw the net about the "high-riser" in the booze ring which has been shipping big quantities of whisky to Tacoma.  
 The drug company was organized only a short time ago.

A check made at the Commercial dock showed that the 13 big boxes containing more than 1,500 quarts of booze confiscated in the raid, arrived on the steamer Admiral Dewey from San Francisco Tuesday. Search for three more cases which arrived on the steamer proved futile.  
 The theory of the prosecuting attorney is that the whisky was brought into Tacoma by means of druggists' permits, then taken to the isolated barn in the woods near Lakeview.  
 All marks showing the contents of the boxes had been carefully planed off at the time the liquor was seized.  
 Sam Cassimer and George Martin, employes of the Auto Baggage & Storage Co., who were arrested when the sheriff stopped the truck load of whisky, have been released on \$750 bail.


