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APPEALS TO SAVE RUMANIA

(United Press Leased Wire.) BERLIN, via wireless to Bayville, L. I., Oct. 27.—Pursuing the defeated Russo-Rumanians, Mackensen's left wing has reached the vicinity of Harsova, twenty-five miles northwest of Constantza. It was officially announced today.

Fleeing Russo-Rumanian forces are evacuating practically all Dobridja, said an official statement from the Bulgarian war office.

"On the whole front the enemy is retreating precipitately toward Tulcea, Braila and Harsova, pursued by our forces," said the statement.

King Ferdinand dispatched personal appeals to the rulers of allied nations to save Rumania from disaster after the fall of Constantza, according to Budapest dispatches.

The messages were sent following a stormy session of the Rumanian cabinet. Rumanian military leaders were said to have been harshly criticised by several of the ministers but supported by the king, who declared that Rumanian defeat was due to the fact that Russia had failed to supply the artillery and munitions she had promised.

German military men expected an early demonstration by the allies probably on the Italian and Macedonian fronts, in response to King Ferdinand's appeal.

SEATTLE, Oct. 27.—John Hildebrandt, pardoned life-terminer who robbed a man on the street Sept. 5, and was shot by a policeman, died here yesterday from his wound. Hildebrandt's family lives in Tacoma, and most of his robberies were committed there.

The steamers Great Northern and Rose City were delayed.



Plot Against U. S. Exposed

(United Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 27.—Secretary of War Baker announced today that he may have another statement to make later on his charge that a plot exists to produce armed conflict between the United States and Mexico.

Administration officials said today Baker's statement was intended as a warning to the Mexican government and a guarantee of the American government's good faith. The administration expects the Carranza government to take final and effective measures for the suppression of Mexican banditry.

Secretary Baker returned today from Martinsburg, W. Va., where he spoke last night.

The belief of other administration leaders, as well as Baker's own, was expressed in the starting statement of last night.

The administration, by making public its knowledge of a danger seriously threatening the relations between this government and the Carranza government, expects Carranza to realize fully this government's unselfish purpose.

Baker's statement is also expected to have an important effect in checking the reported conspiracy on the American side of the border.

While no definite statement could be obtained today the impression was given that these conspirators are Mexican Cientificos of the Diaz faction and Diaz agents, who have headquarters in several large eastern cities and in border towns.

For weeks the war department has been working upon reports received from the interior in Mexico by army officers, agents of the state and justice departments and the secret service. The source of supply of silver in which the bandits have been paid was traced to the American side of the border. It is now said.

Officials declare Baker's characterization, "enemies of the administration's policy toward Mexico," does not implicate Americans at least not those of any prominence.

French Close in on Ft. Vaux

(United Press Leased Wire.) PARIS, Oct. 27.—French troops began closing in upon Fort Vaux, the last important position held by the Germans northeast of Verdun, in heavy attacks last night.

The war office announced today further progress west, and south of Vaux and the capture of 100 prisoners.

The Germans kept up a lively bombardment throughout the night around Fort Douaumont and the Chenois woods, recaptured by the French in Monday's offensive.

REPULSED, SAYS BERLIN BERLIN, via wireless to Bayville, L. I., Oct. 27.—"French troops attacked our positions east of Fort Douaumont at noon yesterday but were completely repulsed under heavy losses," the war office announced this afternoon.
