Mrs. Ruth Reynolds, professional model who has posed undraped for many painters, sculptors and photographers, and whose statuesque beauty is widely admired, makes this startling proposal. "It would," she continued, "go far toward correcting that degrading attitude between the sexes which today engenders so much of vice, morbidity and misery."

"There is no valid reason why young men and women should grow up with this consuming, covert speculation regarding the opposite sex.

"Wholesome educational influences, such as most private and public art schools maintain, would nip prurency in the bud. The best way to allay curiosity is to frankly permit its satisfaction under supervision.

Eliminates Base Thoughts. "Familiarity with the human body as a working model does not breed contempt. Nor does it provoke base thoughts.

"On the contrary, it begets a proper respect for the human being by relegating the physical to its proper proportion and natural functions.

"Study of the undraped figure, too, does much to counteract the

pernicious influence of the suggestive, provocative clothes today worn by women to appeal to just that consuming curiosity."

Morals Tightened. Miss Reynolds maintains there is no discordance between being a professional model and the highest conceptions of ideal womanhood.

"Morals are tightened rather than loosened in the average studio," she declares.

"As for myself, I feel as fully clothed when posing nude before an artist or a class of students as I do when walking on the street in dress and furs.

"Modesty and self-respect are perfect cloaks for even nudity! "Shame? That comes only from the knowledge of doing something wrong, stealthy, unworthy. Shame advertises one's MOTIVE in connection with an act.

COUNTY CHOPS ITS BALLOTS

President Wilson has carried Pierce county with a majority of nearly 2,000 over Hughes, according to returns from all but seven of the county precincts.

The same 210 of the 217 precincts show that Gov. Lister has carried the county with a lead of more than 2,500 over McBride.

All the county offices and state offices, with the exception of the governor, apparently have gone to the republicans.

The county gave Senator Poin-dexter an overwhelming vote for re-election. Albert Johnson has carried the county by a heavy majority over George P. Fishburne, for congress.

Griffith Gets Big Vote. The hottest fight on the county ticket has been between Robert Longmire and John Griffith for sheriff.

Griffith has piled up a heavy vote, keeping Longmire on the uneasy seat as the returns from the various precincts have come in, and showing the present sheriff to the bottom of the list of county officers.

The 210 precincts complete indicate Longmire's re-election by a small majority.

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Democratic National Chairman McCormick at 1:30 a. m. gave out the following statement in reply to another issued at 12:25 a. m. by Republican National Chairman Wilcox:

"President Wilson is re-elected and Mr. Wilcox shows that he is aware of that fact. His will in reply to the charge of some imaginary person that some one expects Mr. Hughes or his manager will try to secure the election through fraud, is worthy of the best traditions of the republican party.

"The public has had a chance to judge the conduct of the conditions of the two candidates and I am perfectly willing to let the people decide which side will resort to desperate methods."
