

Public Markets

EDITOR THE TIMES: In your yesterday's issue I noticed a statement in regard to the public market at 11th and Market streets, to the effect that it would be necessary to abandon that location because of the objections of R. E. Anderson & Co., owners of the market building there.

According to the opinion of Mr. Harmon, these people can legally demand the removal of the market stalls along the curb in front of their property, and in doing so destroy the public market there.

Personally I think such a removal would be an excellent thing as a public illustration of the fallacy of trying to "hog it all."

With the removal of the market to some other location the people would also go to the other floor. Coming to the removal of the present private market location with only the straggling custom that might overflow from the public market.

The market experience of Portland will illustrate this point. There on Yamhill street from 3rd to 4th streets the city established just such curb market stalls and rented them to those who had produce for sale.

Along both sides of that street at this point there had previously been few except dilapidated buildings, ancient and only wearing an appearance of respectability and safety.

As soon as the public market was established there, the owners of the property along that part of the street began making substantial repairs, and in some cases built new buildings for market purposes and rented the stalls to others who had produce for sale. This it shows that it is the coming of the people to a certain district that makes that district valuable to the owners of the property, and it does not make so very much difference what it is that brings the people there.

This is an excellent chance for some other owner of property that is either vacant or unprofitably occupied to offer to the city the use of the walks in front of their property for market purposes. They would thus bring to their property the people who would make their property profitably rentable. A good chance for someone.

KEEPS LIGHT ON ALL NIGHT

Declaring that conditions at the city's municipal power plant are precarious, because of the continuous storms, City Electric Supt. Evans said Thursday that he had kept a light burning in his bedroom all Wednesday night so that he could be warned instantly if an accident shut off city juice.

"We struggled through another stormy night, however, and may get through the spell of bad weather without any serious trouble," said Evans.

Heavy barricades of planks have been built against the doors of the power house, as a possible safeguard if the slides are not too great. Should the entire mill begin to slip, it is admitted that nothing can save the plant.

Real Estate Man Puzzle for Police

Apparently straining under tremendous worry, F. A. Bradley, age 40, a Kansas City real estate man, is being closely scrutinized at police headquarters, where he occupies a special cell. Bradley was taken to headquarters Monday, after his peculiar actions on the streets had interested detectives.

The real estate man came west recently, and after spending all his money he began selling his clothing and personal possessions. When the police picked him up, he was penniless.

Although he admits that he is worried about something, Bradley has persistently refused to tell the nature of his troubles. He asked the police Thursday to file charges of vagrancy against him, so that he could stay longer in jail, intimating that he might reveal his secret if given time.

Telegraphic inquiry of the Kansas City police brought back word that Bradley was known there but that he was not wanted by the authorities.
