 The only automobile road map of the state of Washington issued this year discriminates broadly against Tacoma, according to J. H. Gonyea, deputy city controller, who purchased one of the maps Tuesday.

Only one road is shown on the map as leading out of Tacoma. The highway to Mt. Tacoma leads direct from Seattle. There is no road connection between Tacoma and Seattle. The only road given on the map as entering Tacoma is one connecting this city with Olympia.

The map, published by Edward W. Pulver of San Francisco, is the only 1917 road map on sale in Tacoma, according to Gonyea.

 SAN FRANCISCO, July 10.—New attacks on the state's theory that Thomas Mooney, his wife and other defendants in the preparedness parade bomb plot cases drove to the scene of the Preparedness day explosion in a jitney bus, featured today's session of the Rona Mooney trial.
