WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 6.—Congress in its remarkable ses-sion has at once assured the "ef-fectiveness of American arms" and safeguarded the rights of the people, President Wilson declared (Signed).

In a review of the war legisla-tion definitely completed when adjournment was taken, at 3 o'clock, the president said Ameri-ca's legislative body "has left no doubt as to the spirit and deter-mination of the country."

The president's statement is-sued after the senate had con-curred on a house vote to adjourn at 3 p. m., subject to the call of the president, was issued just be-fore the president went to the capitol to sign bills and formally end the session.

"The 55th congress, now ad-journing, deserves the gratitude and appreciation of a people whose will and purpose I believe it has faithfully expressed. One cannot examine the record of its action without being impressed by its completeness, its courage and its full comprehension of the great task.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 6.—That the captain and two members of the crew of the German sea raider Seeadler were captured by a British destroyer of the Society islands three weeks ago was re-ported here today. According to the stories, the three men were taken to Hong Kong and interned while the launch in which they were cruising was sunk. There was no confirmation.

The remainder of the Seeadler crew is supposed to be on a French ship, which they captured and which they are operating as a raider.
