R. R. MEN MAY ASK INCREASE

(United Press Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Nov. 1.—Representatives of 250,000 railroad employees began a 10-day conference today that is expected to result in formal demand for wage increases averaging 25 to 50 per cent.

Office workers are unionizing. An organization including bookkeepers, stenographers and office assistants has been formed by Joseph Lyons, secretary of the Tacoma Central Labor council.

7 SLACKERS INDICTED

(United Press Leased Wire.) SEATTLE, Oct. 31.—The federal grand jury returned 21 indictments here this afternoon, seven being against slackers and two against men who tried to evade the draft by making false affidavits for exemption claims.

BRITISH OFFICERS COME

(United Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—One hundred and fifty British officers direct from the European trenches to assist in training the new army have arrived at an American port.

WAR FOUR YEARS MORE?

(United Press Leased Wire.) SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 31.—Ten United States senators and 30 congressmen came to San Francisco today bearing a message of the serious situation faced by this country in the great war.

FEWER VESSELS SUNK

(United Press Leased Wire.) LONDON, Oct. 31.—The number of British vessels sunk by submarines during the past week will show less than the number lost last week, according to an authoritative forecast of the official statement given to the United Press this afternoon.

DYNAMITE IN ARMORY

SHOPMEN WALK OUT

(United Press Leased Wire.) OAKLAND, Cal., Oct. 31.—In support of demands for wage increases of 20 per cent, more than 600 employees of the Southern Pacific shops and yards here went on strike today.



RUSSIA USES STERN HAND

(United Press Leased Wire.) PETROGRAD, Nov. 1.—The provisional government took sternly repressive measures against two recalcitrant Russian provinces today. Finland was announced as having been put under jurisdiction of the northern front because of refusal of authorities there to co-operate in evacuation of certain points. Ukraina was hit even harder. The government decided to cut off all money from the central government heretofore given the province for administration because of the growth of a movement there for autonomy. More vigorous measures, it was stated, are in view. Presumably the transfer of Finland to "jurisdiction of the northern front" means a sort of martial law has been proclaimed there.

Willie Ritchie, former lightweight champion, now instructor at Camp Lewis, will appear on the program of the Commercial club smoker Tuesday evening. A jazz band will be part of the entertainment.
