PROMISE HERTLING SUPPORT

(United Press Leased Wire.)
AMSTERDAM, Nov. 30.—Assurance of united support from the centrists, majority socialists and progressives was given to the new German chancellor, Count von Hertling, following his reichstag address of yesterday, according to Berlin dispatches today.

Dr. Trimborn, centrist leader, spoke immediately following the chancellor. He expressed "full confidence" in his course and especially announced his approval of the government's attitude toward Russia.

Philip Scheidemann, majority socialist leader, declared he "joyfully welcomed the prospect of peace with Russia," and admitted that the new government was "better than his predecessor."

Herr Fischback, progressive leader, added similar approval and significantly declared: "We are willing to reserve until a later date the problems which have been dividing us."

Deputy Stresemann declared Italy's punishment "was merited" in his speech approving von Hertling.

Count von Westarp, leader of the German conservatives, added his emphatic support of the new regime and advocated the sternest measures of war against Germany's foes.

The only note of disapproval in the general chorus of approbation and pledges of support came from Dr. Hugo Haase, minority socialist leader.

"A separate peace with Russia is not enough," he asserted. "We want a general peace, with no annexations, east or west."

Hope for Peace With Russia By Christmas

(United Press Leased Wire.)
BERLIN, via London, Nov. 30.—Chancellor von Hertling's maiden speech in the reichstag, aroused nation-wide hopes today that peace with Russia would come before Christmas. German newspapers express gratification at the outlook.

The chancellor's speech declared his willingness for Germany to negotiate peace with Russia the moment that government should send fully accredited envoys to Berlin, authorized to act. The Trotsky-Lenin proposals, he said, indicated "principles susceptible to decision," on which negotiations might be predicated. The chancellor declared that a number of important plans for
