Two committees, one of women and the other of men, were named by Mayor Fawcett Saturday to investigate conditions at the city contagious hospital.
 Dr. Eva St. Clair Osborne, Mrs. S. E. Starbuck, and Mr. John Quever from one committee and A. V. Love, Frank Day and P. B. Haskell the other.
 Fawcett said that he had named the committees as a result of Commissioner Gronen's demand in the council Friday for an investigation.
 Gronen said Saturday that he had been preparing a committee of investigation, on the mayor's request, and was surprised that Fawcett had already asked someone to investigate.
 Gronen said that he would announce his committee later and ask for a separate investigation.
 The hospital probe is a result of charges made Thursday in affidavits made public by Commissioner Pettit. Former patients at the hospital charged that treatment was bad, food was unfit to eat, and the conduct of A. L. Fawcett, superintendent of the institution, improper.

U. S. WON'T SEND TROOPS TO SIBERIA

 WASHINGTON, D. C., March 1.—It was stated on high authority, following President Wilson's cabinet meeting late today that the U. S. probably would not interpose objection to Japan's sending an expeditionary force into Siberia in the cause of self-defense.
 At the same time, belief was expressed the U. S. would not send forces to act in conjunction with the Japanese.

Report Films To Answer For Are Disloyal

(Special to The Times.)
 OLYMPIA, March 2.—The state council of defense has sent out an appeal to the county councils of defense urging them to make detailed reports of all disloyal or unpatriotic films, lectures or publications.
 The state council also will distribute many posters depicting Germany's war aims.
 "Complaints are being received that certain moving picture films being shown in the state are so pacific a nature as to be actually disloyal," says the council. "Also that certain publications said to be the work of Pastor Russell are being sold by women canvassers and that they contain some passages of a very unpatriotic character." Reports on the films, "Civilization" and "Creation" are particularly requested.

Mrs. B. A. Ballator of Carbonado, has been arrested in San Francisco at the request of Tacoma authorities on a charge of kidnaping her son, August Eche, age 14, from his father, Theodore Eche of Carbonado.
 Mrs. Ballator was divorced from Eche and the custody of the boy awarded to the father.
 She has stated she will fight extradition.


