

PETROGRAD, March 22.—It is regarded as probable here that Mikhail Lenine, premier in the bolshevik government, will shortly assume the agriculture portfolio in the cabinet, believing the improvement of the peasants' condition to be a sure way of defeating the influence of the Left element.
