PLATINUM IS SEIZED

(United Press Leased Wire.)
 WASHINGTON, D. C., May 14.—Platinum has been commandeered for war purposes, the industries board announced today. Supplies in the hands of jewelers, manufacturers, wholesalers and importers and platinum received by them up to June 30 must be sold to the government at \$105 a troy ounce. Iridium is also requisitioned at \$175 an ounce, palladium at \$135 an ounce. Commandeering became effective May 1.

Jewelers may withhold 25 per cent of their platinum supply on condition they waive all claims to additional compensation from the government.

Moreover, we have had a dozen other telephone calls from interested citizens who expressed a willingness to do likewise.
