

**MOOSE ASK  
CAMP FOR  
WOUNDED**

Resolutions urging the government to establish institutions for the training of returned wounded and maimed soldiers at each of the army cantonments in the U. S. were among the most important actions of the Loyal Order of Moose at its convention business session in Moose hall Tuesday morning.

Similar action was recommended to the supreme lodge and to other lodges throughout the nation. The resolutions were offered by the Moose lodge members in the Honolulu regiment which is now stationed at Camp Murray. The Honolulu lodge is represented 100 per cent in this regiment, and is attending the convention in full strength. The soldier members also have been extended the full privileges of the Tacoma Moose hall.

During the business session Tuesday here was a parade on the downtown streets, headed by the Moose band from Seattle, and including the Moose drill team, drum corps and legion, and a goat—the convention mascot. The 1918 state convention will close Tuesday night with election of officers and selection of a meeting place for next year. There will be a grand parade at 7 p. m., followed by a band, drum corps and drill team contest at 22nd and Pacific ave. at 7:30 p. m. At 8 p. m. will come the grand opening of the Moose carnival at 22nd and Pacific ave. The crowning of the Goddess of Liberty will take place at 10 p. m.

**BURLESON  
LINES UP  
FOR WETS**

(United Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, D. C., June 25.—Cabinet members were sharply divided on the prohibition question at the hearing of the senate agricultural committee today, with Secretary of the Navy Daniels espousing the measure and Postmaster General Burleson on the side of the wets.

Daniels contends that the efficiency has increased wherever prohibition has been adopted. Burleson said such a law "might result in delaying the successful prosecution of the war."

In response to a question by Senator Kenyon, Burleson said he was not speaking for the administration but expressing his personal views. "We cannot afford to experiment with a nation's destiny," was the answer today of Edward Hurley, chairman of the shipping board, in opposing the war-time prohibition of the use of beer and wine. Hurley frankly said he doesn't know whether prohibition would reduce the efficiency of shipyards, "but," he said, "I don't want to take any chances. The more risk in war time prohibition than in conscription of labor," said he.



**War Garden Salads**

Of all the fruits of the war garden there is none which tempts the capricious summer appetite like the salad greens and salad vegetables.

Few persons, however depressed or irritated by the heat, can resist the lure of a crisp green and white salad, with a dash of scarlet tomato or pepper, and the naive dressing. The tender leaves and sprigs smooth coolness of oil or mayonnaise water dress are best served with plain French dressing of oil and vinegar, or combined with tender asparagus tips or heart of celery and lettuce. Often it is eaten as a filling for thin sandwiches.

Endives Wholesome. The blanched, crisp leaves of endive, mixed with a few chives and dressed with mayonnaise, give one of the most wholesome salads known.

Serve leaf lettuce very crisp and cold with a dressing made of two hard-boiled eggs chopped and

onions and cabbage an hour before needed, washing carefully in cold water.

Wrap the salad greens or vegetables in a square of clean, very wet cloth and lay directly upon the ice. In cutting up or mixing salads of every sort use only a silver knife or fork and do all mixing in a glass or china bowl.

During hot weather salad may be served twice a day with benefit to the health, using greens and vegetables as appetizers or supplements to the main meal, and fruit salads as desserts.

**TAKE KITCHEN  
TO WORKERS**

(Special to The Times.) LONDON, June 25.—Traveling kitchens are England's newest method of solving her food problem.

Women working in munitions plants have no time to cook. Therefore the traveling kitchen, which is a trolley car with a counter in the middle, comes to them with food piping hot, and they buy and eat just as good a meal as they could prepare in their own kitchens at home.

The inventor is Alderman C. F. Spencer, director of the National Kitchen Division of the Food Ministry. It is now proposed to add automobile kitchens, which will be limited in their travels by the extent of the streetcar lines.

**PUTS BLAME  
ON WEATHER**

(United Press Leased Wire.) LONDON, June 25.—The Austrian war office admits the Austrian disaster to the extent that "by reason of the high water and bad weather," its armies evacuated the other position which we had won on the right bank of the Piave.

Vienna claims that the order for the retreat was given four days ago and that the maneuver was carried out with such secrecy that Italian artillery was investigated on bombarding empty trench positions.

Some confusion exists regarding the number of Austrian prisoners. The Italian embassy here announced that 45,000 had been taken. This was confirmed by a Washington dispatch quoting the Italian embassy there.

The official statement of the Italian war office yesterday, however, mentioned only 4,000 prisoners.
