

### DONT'S FOR SWIMMERS

Life Saver Gives Pointers as Water Season Opens



Life-Saving and Swimming Expert. In view of the fact that over 8,000 persons have drowned in the past year, I think much loss of life will be eliminated if the following rules are adopted by bathers and swimmers.

Swimming is essential for health and personal safety. For those who that can and cannot swim, it is best to play safe in water until you have mastered watermanship to a degree of personal safety for yourself and others.

DON'T FOR SWIMMERS Don't bathe shortly after dining; wait at least two hours.

Don't sit in a boat or stand about undressed after being in the water. Don't swim far after a hard day's work, or over-exertion after other forms of exercise.

Don't bathe in unfrequented or secluded parts. Don't bathe alone if subject to giddiness or faintness.

Don't dive into the water without first ascertaining its depth. Don't take fright if you fall into the water with your clothes on; remember, clothes float, and assist you to float.

Don't take fright if seized with cramps; keep cool; turn on the back and endeavor to rub the place affected. If the leg is drawn up with pain, swim slowly with the arms only.

Don't attempt to get into a boat coming to your rescue; catch hold of the stern until assisted together.

Don't tread water by keeping the legs moving up and down, as in walking upstairs. Hold an oar or canoe paddle, plank or branch of a tree in the middle when thrown to you.

Don't swim without some recognized signal to give your fellow-swimmers, if subject to cramps, such as lifting one arm or shouting for help.

Don't dive out of or try to get into a boat from the stern and get in from the stern, but only then from a boat with a broad beam.

Don't swim away from the shore, always along the shore. Don't swim without company if you have a weak heart, and only then after consulting a doctor.
