Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Gould spent a portion of last week in Cuba.

Eighth Grade examinations will be held at Lopez, Deer Harbor, East Sound and Friday Harbor Jan. 21 and 22.

The telephone cable to be laid across Upright channel between Shaw and Lopez islands arrived from Halifax this week.

Representative Sims, of Port Townsend, who has many acquaintances in this county, gets the chairmanship of the house fisheries committee.

The Morgan Oyster Co., of Seattle, and Capt. Bert Hale have bought the little eight ton steamer "G. Vasa" with which they will engage in shrimp fishing in this county, making their headquarters here.

The water tower at the county well is high in cost as well as altitude. The commissioners at their recent session allowed bills for material used in the tower amounting to \$304.41 and labor bills amounting to \$352.05.

Mr. Wagner, of Seattle, a well known civil engineer who was for many years an influential factor in politics, was here on the 8th and 9th to file a large number of options on lands on Orcas, Waldron and Sacia islands.

Rev. C. C. Pratt, of Bellingham, a former pastor of the Methodist church here and now district superintendent of the Washington Children's Home Society, will preach at the Methodist church Sunday morning and at the Presbyterian church in the evening.

## Death of George Croft

George Croft, youngest son of the late George Croft, of Portsmouth, Kingston, Ontario, died at the Jubilee hospital, Victoria, B. C., after a critical operation for stomach trouble, on January 5th, 1909. The remains were shipped to Vancouver, accompanied by his wife and sister, Mrs. J. M. Fleming, where they were met by a number of friends and schoolmates to witness the last sad rites at Sapperton cemetery, where by his own request his remains were laid beside his brother, who died some years ago.

Mr. Croft came out to the coast only four months ago in search of health, intending to spend the winter with his sister, Mrs. J. M. Fleming, at Kanaka bay. He was taken very ill there and was removed to Victoria for medical treatment. For some weeks it was thought he would recover, but interna hemorrhage set in and he sank slowly four weeks after the operation.

He is survived by his wife, formerly Miss Hannah Kerr of Portsmouth, and two little children, son and daughter. He was a member of I. O. O. F. Lodge No. 102, of Deseronto, Ontario. Many thanks are due to the Odd Fellows of Victoria for their kindness in arranging for the shipment of the remains to Vancouver and also to the Jubilee hospital staff, who kindly rendered every assistance to the relatives. On account of the heavy storm prevailing at the time his San Juan relatives and friends were unable to make connections in time to be present at the funeral.

## Success of Meningitis Serum

In a recent number of the Journal of Experimental Medicine, Dr. Simon Flexner, the head of the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research, gave the result of the use of the serum for cerebro spinal meningitis which bears his name in 442 cases. The article showed that complete recovery took place in 67 per cent and death in 33 per cent of the cases, but that the mortality did not exceed 25 per cent, if cases in which serum was used only 24 hours before death were excluded, and Dr. Flexner is convinced that if the serum is used within four days of the first appearance of the symptoms, the death rate can be reduced to 15 per cent. Prior to the discovery of the Flexner serum, the mortality had ranged from 50 to 90 per cent, and the present discovery affords certainly one of the best hopes of modern medicine.
