

Diligent efforts have been made by Bellingham mill men, aided by J. A. Prof. McIlvain, of the public school, calls the attention of parents to the provisions of the school law relating to compulsory attendance and to excuses, which the Islander has published in former years. The regulations of the state board of education make it mandatory upon teachers to require excuses from parents or guardians in all cases of absence or tardiness and no excuse for absence is deemed valid except for sickness. The compulsory attendance law applies to all children between the ages of 8 and 15 years, and to children between 15 and 16 years of age not regularly and lawfully engaged in some useful and remunerative occupation. Mr. McIlvain suggests to parents that they can very materially aid the teachers "by just a little thoughtful co-operation in the observance of the forms in the requirements of the law."
