Ole S. Hagen, of East Sound, made a business trip to Bellingham last Friday. In talking with the editor of the Islander regarding the apple crop this season he said: "So far as I have observed the yield is rather lighter than usual and the fruit is somewhat smaller but of fine flavor. This condition I believe is due to our having such an unusually dry season at the time when the trees most needed the moisture. Most of the trees are unusually clean and the fruit practically free from infection of any kind." Mr. Hagen is an "old timer" on Orcas island and is one of the best fruit growers in the county.

It is reported that Mr. Moore, the East Sound fruit canneryman, has put up fifty tons of pears this season. Gallon cans have been used and the entire pack sold as pie fruit, although, it is claimed that the product is as choice as any table fruit sold. The fruit growers realized from \$20.00 to \$21.50 per ton for the pears delivered at the cannery. Practically all of them were Bartlett's, a variety that it is difficult to dispose of at a fair price on the open market owing to the fact that they are not good keepers. Most of the better varieties of winter pears are shipped east and these net the grower a good figure, in almost every instance.
