Mr. McEntire was taking a good look at the metropolis before starting in on his winter's work on his mining property the Swamp King, near Rock Cut, which he is working in the interest of Colville and Seattle people. The shaft is down 25 feet on a rich vein of free gold bearing ore, and 75 feet of work will be done this winter. A double compartment shaft 4x7 in the clear has been built, and a two-foot vein has been followed from the surface, getting better with depth.
