### THE LOCAL NEWS

Dr. L. A. Kerr and L. Stannus will place 120,000 Pennsylvania brook trout in the headwaters of Mill creek the first of next week.

E. F. Larios has 15 spanish students taking lessons Tuesday and Friday nights at the Rickey block. On Monday and Thursday nights he has a bookkeeping and commercial arithmetic class, which has been started by special request, and in which more may enroll at any time.

A son was born to Mr. and Mrs. C. T. Houtchins Wednesday.

Mrs. D. S. Diehl, who was taken ill Tuesday, was taken to the sanitarium that afternoon, and was operated on the next morning. She is now convalescing.

A. B. Cummings of Arden lost everything Tuesday in a fire which burned down the house in which they lived. The house belonged to the lumber company. The probable loss was about \$500.

The appealed case of Lewis vs. Wellard was decided this week by the supreme court in favor of the plaintiff, who was represented by Attorney J. A. Rochford. The point in controversy was that a partial payment contract is not forfeited by the buyer in case the payments are not all made, until the seller has tendered an executed deed to the buyer. This if refused would return the land to the seller. In the Lewis vs. Wellard case no such tender was made.

D. Laury is getting a \$50 coffee urn for dining room use at the Debs house.

The state supreme court has affirmed the decision of the Spokane county superior court in the case of Edwin L. Gauthier against Peter Morrison, N. L. Needham, M. A. Saunders and Minnie Saunders. Plaintiff appealed, asking to be adjudged entitled to the possession of certain lands, but the supreme court finds from the evidence furnished that the state courts have no jurisdiction, and that the remedy, if any, is in the land department of the United States government. Mr. Gauthier was formerly a resident of Colville, and the land in question was rich valley land near Spokane, upon which he and others filed claims, alleging that no prior claim had ever been established.

The big steam dredging machine on the Colville river passed through the Hall bridge on Tuesday five miles north of town. There is now only about three miles of work yet to do and the entire Colville valley will be left high and dry. It is estimated on good authority that this work has benefited about 17,000 acres of land, and at least 40 per cent of this amount can now be converted into first class timothy meadow which heretofore has been covered with tulle swamps that were absolutely valueless. The approximate cost of this project will be \$35,000, while the benefits derived will aggregate at least \$100,000.
