THE LOCAL NEWS

At the recent city primary election Dr. A. B. Cook was again chosen as mayor, subject to the regular city election to be held December 3. It may be truthfully said that during the past year Dr. Cook has devoted a great deal of his time to the business interests of the city of Colville, and at no time has any citizen come to the mayor with a complaint, suggestion or request but what the doctor gave the matter his personal and immediate attention.

Henry R. Spedden is also a candidate for the same office on an independent ticket. And it can be said of Mr. Spedden that during the past ten years he has at all times and on all occasions displayed a public spirited interest in the welfare of Colville and Stevens county.

Rufus Gillie who for the past three years has been connected with the mechanical department of the Kettle Falls Scimitar, is now on the cases in the Examiner office.

Deputy Sheriff Charles Haines of Walkers Prairie, the officer that arrested Bartholomew, was in Colville this week. Mr. Haines has acted as deputy sheriff in Stevens county for nearly 25 years, serving under democratic, republican and populist officials, being considered one of the most efficient deputies in the county. Mr. Haines claims to be the pioneer threshing machine man north of Walla Walla, having threshed for men on Walkers Prairie and the Spokane Indian Reservation this season, that he has pulled into their fields every fall for over thirty years. He states that it is his intention to put another big steam outfit out next season.

The statement made in some of the newspapers that the city water was low and the pressure lessened during the Acorn Bros. fire last Friday morning, is denied by Water Commissioner C. O. Smith, who states that the water in the reservoir was not lowered more than a foot. Chief Thomas states that the water in the reservoir would supply two constant streams under full pressure for at least seven hours.

The members of the Colville fire department state that their 11th annual ball to be given next Tuesday night at the Masonic Temple will be the social success of the season.

W. W. Bean moved an eight ton boiler from Winslow to the basin mill the first of the week at the small cost of thirty dollars.

At the banquet given by the Spokane chamber of commerce last Tuesday Governor M. E. Hay gave an interesting talk on the necessity of the Federated Clubs in the Inland Empire making arrangements for the storage of the apple crops. The Governor's remarks were well received, and were corroborated by F. M. Marsh of the National Bank of Commerce who stated that the prosperity of the Inland Empire depended largely on the disposition of the apple crops. Mr. Marsh outlined the following plan: That suitable storehouses be established in the various apple sections where the fruit growers could store their products and be able to realize from 40 to 80 per cent on the market value of their crop. He further said it was up to the local banks to handle this paper for the fruit growers and that the banks in Spokane would furnish money to such banks provided that the business was more than the local banks could handle. This plan was heartily endorsed by the 400 delegates present, and it is believed that some such plan will be perfected to handle the 1913 apple crop in the Inland Empire.

J. L. Montour of Meyers Falls was brought to the Colville Sanitarium on Saturday.

The management of the Colville Leader states that Saturday the opening day of the "Reorganization sale" was the biggest day for business in the history of the store. Mr. Hansen in charge of the shoe department states that he alone fitted and sold shoes to the amount of \$150.

Colville precinct, which registered 926 votes and did its voting at one polling place, has been divided into three precincts. Chewelah, which was one of the last to report election returns this year, has been divided into east and west Chewelah precincts. Pleasant Valley, which was merged into Columbia precinct, has been reinstated and the boundaries of Riverside have been made smaller by attaching some territory to neighboring precincts. New voting districts have been created as follows: Cummins precinct, between between Aladdin and Northport, and Edendale precinct, lying near Gifford.
