the center line of said alley to the south street line of Sixth avenue.

Section 3. That there is hereby created and established a local improvement district to be designated as "local sewer improvement district No. 2" which said district shall contain all of the lots, tracts and parcels of land hereinafter described, and they are hereby declared to be specially benefited by the construction of said sewer system, on account of the topography of the ground and the convenience of sewage and drainage into said sewer system.

The property included within said district and none other shall be deemed to be and shall be the property benefited by said improvement, and the total cost and expense of the improvement herein shall be defrayed by the collection of special assessments upon the property included in said district in the manner provided by chapter 98 of the session laws of the state of Washington, approved March 17, 1911, and entitled: "An act relating to local improvements in cities and towns, and repealing certain acts and parts of acts," and by the ordinance of the city of Colville.

Beginning from a connection in the center of Maple street at the intersection of said street with the alley between Third avenue and Fourth avenue; thence north along the center line of Maple street to a point on the south street line of Fifth avenue.

Beginning with a connection in the center of block 27, Meyers addition; thence north along the center line of the alley between Elm street and Maple street to the south street line of Fifth avenue.

Section 2. That there is hereby created and established a local improvement district to be designated as "local sewer improvement district No. 2," which said district shall contain all of the lots, tracts and parcels of land hereinafter described, and they are hereby declared to be specially benefited by the construction of said sewer system, on account of the topography of the ground and the convenience of sewage and drainage into said sewer system.

The property included within said district and none other shall be deemed to be and shall be the property benefited by said improvement, and the total cost and expense of the improvement herein shall be defrayed by the collection of special assessments upon the property included in said district in the manner provided by chapter 98 of the session laws of the state of Washington, approved March 17, 1911, and entitled: "An act relating to local improvements in cities and towns, and repealing certain acts and parts of acts," and by the ordinance of the city of Colville.

Section 4. Special assessments payable in ten equal annual installments and bearing interest at eight per cent per annum, shall, in accordance with law and general ordinances of the city be assessed to and levied upon all of the lots, tracts and parcels of land and other property within said district, all of which said lots, tracts and parcels of land and other property in said district are specially benefited by said improvement. For the purpose of this improvement there is hereby created a special fund to be designated as "local sewer improvement fund district No. 2," into which shall be paid the special assessments authorized by law and the ordinances of the city of Colville, for the purpose of redeeming the bonds issued in payment of the cost and expense of said improvement, herein provided for, and from which shall be paid said bonds, to the extent thereof. In no event shall the city of Colville be liable for the payment of said bonds or any part thereof.

Section 5. For the purpose of making payment of the cost and expense of said improvement, there shall be issued by the city of Colville, local improvement bonds, to be styled "local sewer improvement bonds, district No. 2," payable on or before ten years from the date of issuance, and bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable annually, as provided by law and the ordinances of the city of Colville, said bonds shall be redeemable only out of the local improvement fund created by this ordinance. In case said improvement is made by contract, said bonds shall be delivered to the contractor in redemption of warrants on the fund hereinafter created issued on estimates of the city engineer, said warrants drawing interest at the bond rate, or the city of Colville may, at its election, sell said bonds and make such redemption in cash. The improvement bonds herein provided for may be sold by the city treasurer at public or private sale at not less than their par value and accrued interest. In such event, the proceeds thereof shall be applied in payment of the cost and expense of the improvement. The city treasurer may incur reasonable expense for advertising in connection with the sale or attempted sale of the said bonds. If said bonds be sold at public sale, notice thereof shall be published in the official city newspaper in two issues next preceding the date of such sale, which notice shall specify the time and place of sale.

Section 6. The city clerk is hereby directed to advertise for bids for making said improvement, reserving to the city the right to reject any and all bids. In case a satisfactory bid is received and accepted, the contract for said improvement shall provide that the same shall be completed in all things in accordance with the plans and specifications for said improvement, herein referred to, and shall provide that the contractor making the same shall accept the bonds herein provided for at par and accrued interest in payment of the contract price for such work, or in redemption of warrants issued therefor to the extent of such bond issue, if the city shall so elect; provided that an attempt on the part of the city to sell said bonds shall not be construed as an election. In case no satisfactory bid is received, said improvement shall be made by the city by day labor, unless otherwise ordered by the city council, and payment warrants to be issued, and redeemed by the sale of said bonds as provided herein and by general ordinance.

Section 7. No bid, acceptance of any bid, or contract relating to said improvement, shall be binding upon the city, until the assessments herein provided for shall be confirmed by ordinance. The city shall not be under any obligation or duty to confirm any assessment or assessment roll, and if, for any reason, the same be not confirmed, the bid, acceptance of bid or contract shall be of no force or effect. If the work is let by contract the city shall not be liable or responsible, in any manner, except to account for the local improvement bonds and fund herein provided for.

Section 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after five days after the date of its passage, approval and publication.


CALL FOR BIDS.


