MEETING WITH SUCCESS.

The Juno-Echo mine located near Chewelah, under the management of Henry R. Spedden, promises to develop into a paying mining proposition. Since development work started last spring a new hoist and boiler have been installed which has a capacity for sinking about 500 feet. The shaft has been sunk to the 150-foot level, and about 100 feet of drifting done on this level.

The working shaft is now being sunk from the 150 to the 250-foot level, and is now down 25 feet below the 150-foot level. Two shifts are working and the work is progressing at the rate of three feet per day. It is the intention of the management to cross the ore body, and drift on it at the 250-foot level, preparatory to making steady shipments.

Hindley to the Front. Official confirmation of his appointment as captain of the 19th battalion, Winnipeg, was received last night from Ottawa, Canada, by former Mayor W. J. Hindley of Spokane, now pastor of the Central Congregational church of the former city.

It carries with it the rank of captain. The 19th battalion is known in Canadian military circles as the "little black devils" and the original unit that went overseas has been practically annihilated in the last eighteen months, being in the thick of the fighting around Ypres, Sanctuary Woods, Festubert, St. Julien and more recently on the Somme. The Rev. Mr. Hindley hopes to retain his connection with the Central church until the regiment sails for overseas, when he will accompany it to the front.
