NO CHILDREN ON OREGON STAGE
 All Under Sixteen Years Will Not Be Allowed to Perform.

PORTLAND, Or., Dec. 5.—No more children under the age of 16 are to be allowed to perform on the stage in this state.

This announcement comes in the form of an order from the child labor commission to the effect that boys and girls are not permitted to don the grease paint and rouge and other make-up necessities and appear before the footlights.

The movement against the youthful Theatians was first agitated by the Boys' and Girls' Aid society, and was mostly due to the fact that many sketch teams the members of which were under age were performing their acts in vaudeville houses where intoxicants are dispensed.

The law relating to child labor states that children under 16 are not to be employed after 7 o'clock p. m., and it was under this clause that the commission's action was taken.

As a result of the unexpected order, the "Ben Hur" company has been compelled to discharge 30 boys and girls who have been taking part in some of the scenes. These are all local children.

Little Actors of Prominence.
 By the order four vaudeville teams are broken up and the Arcade and Fritz theaters are badly handicapped, owing to the fact that their bills for this week are made up for the most part of juveniles.

Nearly all of the child vaudeville performers have within the last month appeared on the stage of the various continuous performance houses in Tacoma.

The Mithy sisters, two of their names being under age, were prevented from appearing. The Taylors, the four boys who sang themselves into the hearts of fond mothers, are only tots and were not allowed to do their turn. The Monoids, an acrobatic team, were badly crippled, as two of the quartet are under age. The four Braghtons, who showed at the Arcade, had to be left off the bill.

Draw Good Salary.
 These young ones were all drawing high salaries, the usual weekly stipend being from \$25 to \$50 each. In some cases the money received by them is used for the support of the

mother, but it is usually a case where the father is the "business manager," and he receives the pay envelope. These children have appeared on stages through the rival vaudeville circuits extending from Spokane to San Francisco, including Tacoma, Whatcom, Seattle and other cities.

CALVERT ON YAKIMA LANDS
 Says Interior Department Has Had Whole Matter Tied Up.

OLYMPIA, Dec. 5.—State Land Commissioner S. A. Calvert has returned from Washington, D. C., where he went for the purpose of laying before the interior department the application on behalf of the state for the selection of arid lands in Yakima county, under the terms of the Cary act, the land being that to be watered by the proposed extension of the Sunnyside irrigation canal.

The whole matter, under the rules of the department, was hung up for thirty days, at which time some further showing will be made concerning the sufficiency of the company's intake at the head of its ditch. At the same time the protests will be considered which have been filed in the case. It is stated that nothing has as yet been furnished the department in support of these protests, which consist of the representations that another company claims to be able to water a much larger area of arid land if the state should grant it a contract. No surveys or plans have been filed in support of this claim, and unless something of this kind is done within the next hirt ydays, the protests can have little or no effect.
