DECISION IS OF LITTLE MOMENT

Action of Montana Supreme Court Is Unimportant.

NEW YORK, Dec. 30.—The forthcoming Montana supreme court decision on the question whether the Amalgamated Copper company is an outlaw under the constitution and statutes of Montana, is said to be of no great consequence to the shareholders.

There is no reason to suppose that Amalgamated will declare an extra dividend from the Boston and Montana treasury. Even should it be able to do this decision to strengthen its local hold upon that treasury.

DIVISION SOON TO BE CREATED

Orders Affecting Army on Pacific Coast Expected Daily. SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 29.—The administration of the new division of the Pacific to be established shortly, with headquarters in San Francisco, will be much less complex than the division of the Pacific of about ten years ago.

Under the old regime, which was abolished just because of its unnecessary complexity, the division staff, overlapped and conflicted with the department staff, so there were two quartermasters, commissaries, two purveyors, etc. Under the present arrangement the two great supply departments, quartermaster and commissary, will be in the hands of but one officer each.

Orders formally creating the new division are expected every day, and Gen. MacArthur is expected to return from his six weeks' trip to the Hawaiian Islands on the steamship Si-

beria, scheduled to reach here tomorrow, the new division will soon be a reality.

Gen. MacArthur has several important court-martial findings to review, notably the trials of Sergt-Major Otta, artillery corps, for intoxication and rudeness to a commissioned officer, and of Private Clark Magee, the colored hospital corps man, who made a murderous assault on Lieut. B. J. Edgar, assistant surgeon.

Capt. G. W. Ruthers, chief commissary, is also waiting to consult with Gen. MacArthur before he makes his experiments with the new ration. Already 5200 pounds of this new ration have been shipped to the Presidio. Capt. Ruthers will make his trial only on troops who have been to the Philippines, and been tried on the ration. It is not intended for the use of troops in a home garrison, but altogether for men in the field, who are cut off from the regular channels of supply.

New Ration Plan.

The problem of feeding an army is one of the most difficult in the whole administration. If the troops could be operated without feeding the problems involved would be comparatively simple. This is proved by the many battles that have been lost and the countries ruined through loss of supplies.

Furthermore, the ration of a soldier is directly related to his usefulness. He must be fed like a horse, or any other animal which has to be strengthened for a specific purpose. The rations are, therefore, chosen to nourish the soldiers in such a way that the qualities of strength, endurance and resistance will be developed.

BIG SKY SCRAPER 105 STORIES

NEW YORK, Dec. 29.—The tallest building on earth is to be erected in lower Broadway. If present plans are carried out. With five stories below the street level, forty stories high, from the entrance to the top floor, and surmounted by a sixty-foot tower, the gigantic new building will have a total height of 615 feet, making it a little over twice as high as the Flatiron building, and almost as tall again as the Park Row building, which at present holds the record.

This building will extend one full block on Broadway and its cost, including the site, will reach \$10,000,000. The land is said to have been secured and the completion of the building within one year is promised.
