CHANGE IN ELECTION LAW

NEW BILL MAKING RADICAL CHANGES INTRODUCED IN STATE LEGISLATURE.

Provides for the Furnishing of Duplicate Poll Books to the Election Officers.

Radical changes in the law relating to the registration of voters and the election laws have been introduced in the legislature by Representative Twichell, of King.

Two bills have been introduced by Mr. Twichell, the first of which provides that duplicate poll books shall be furnished election officers in which the original signature of the voter shall be recorded.

The purpose of the amendment is to make identification absolute. Instead of the judges and clerks of election having a certified copy of the registration in his precinct, as now, they would have two duplicate registration books, each containing the original signature of the voter registered.

DON'T HEED INSTRUCTIONS

FEDERAL OFFICERS ARE VERY ACTIVE IN THE STATE CAPITAL CITY.

They Are Working Overtime in the Interest of the Several Senatorial Candidates.

Executive intimations and orders from the departments at Washington have no effect upon those members of the federal brigade who are definitely committed in the senatorial contest, is the report from Olympia.

It is significant of the activity of the federal brigade that the senator in office cannot control the members of the staff of the federal government. Old-timers will remember that when John L. Wilson was at the helm he rounded up the entire federal brigade and brought the members to Olympia at their own expense and they conducted a pretty active campaign here in the interest of the man whose fortunes were at stake.

This is the first time a senator has sought re-election, and the men whom he had placed in office have failed to rally to his support. In part this fact is traceable to the circumstance that Foster sought to build up a machine by appointing the other man's friends to office.

At the outset of his term Foster intended to reward his friends, but outside influences forced recognition of rival factions in the interest of party harmony. That is why Charley Hopkins was appointed United States marshal, an appointment which Foster has regretted consistently since.
