

**RICHEST WOMAN.**  
Hetty Green Cuts Interest Rates to City, Breaking the Market.

NEW YORK, May 5.—With the aid of Mrs. Hetty Green, Controller Metz has been enabled to defeat the financiers of Wall street, and to save the city thousands of dollars.

It has developed, when the city's bond balance was made out and compared with balances for a month or more past, that on several occasions, when the city treasury was in dire need of immediate funds, Mrs. Green had broken the market. Interest rates tumbled because she refused to press the city when the Wall street banks were demanding high rates.

Within the last month she has lent the city \$4,500,000 at rates a shade under the charges of the big bankers of Wall street, and it is said that had more money been needed, she would have opened up her coffers over at the Chemcan National and given more.


