When the fact was first discovered is uncertain, but it has been known for a number of years by Hawaiian physicians and recently a number of mainland physicians have tested it who vouch for its efficacy. The juice is expressed from the fresh fruit, and sweetened, or it may be used from the canned fruit with very satisfactory results and is then administered by spoonfuls to the sufferer for some time. The acids of the fruit seem to digest the membrane which causes the closing of the throat, and the relief is apparent almost at once. Cures are reported of cases of diphtheria in which all other remedies had failed.

**PRESERVED PEARS AND PEACHES**  
 Peel the pears without removing the stems; peel and stone the peaches. Weigh them and allow a pound of granulated sugar to every pound of the fruit. Cover the bottom of a preserving kettle with a layer of sugar, put fruit on this, another layer of sugar, and proceed thus until all are used. Let the kettle heat slowly at the side of the stove and stew the fruit in sugar until they are clear and tender. This should not require much over half an hour. The fruit must then be removed from the syrup with a perforated skimmer and spread out on large platters, while the syrup
