EVERY LYNDEN FARM SHOULD HAVE A SOW AND LITTER

"A sow for every farm is a good slogan now," says Director S. B. Nelson of the State College Extension Service. "One sow and her pigs on one farm, would not, by many of us, be considered of much importance. But when you multiply this one sow and her pigs by the number of farms in Washington, we begin to see some pork."

"Extend this slogan," says Director Nelson, "For the state is capable of producing meat, vast amounts of it. And if we start with but one sow and her pigs on every farm, we soon shall have pouring into the markets, thousands of fat porkers, where hundreds now come. We need the pork. The farmer needs the money that he would get for this pork."

"Most of our farmers agree that on every farm, large or small, enough goes to waste every year to keep a sow and her family. Suppose that every farmer in the whole agricultural west, should keep a sow and pigs; more pigs than that if he desired, but at least one sow. We should then see a great pork-producing industry reaching far beyond these breeders and feeders who make a specialty of this business. Let these pigs be kept on the farm, on largely waste, until they are two-thirds or four-fifths grown. Sell them then, all but the old sow. And the farmer would take in a nice profit on his time, labor and feed in spite of the present high cost of grain.

"We can base a prophecy on what would happen were this slogan 'A Sow on every farm' carried out, from what has happened lately in the sheep industry of the Pacific Northwest. Four or five years ago, the suggestion went out urging that a small band of sheep be placed on the average farm in Whitman county. At that time, there were less than a score of these small farm-bands in the country. Now, the assessor's rolls show that there are in Whitman county, four or five hundred of these small farm sheep-bands. Their number is growing.
