FORMER LYNDEN CITIZEN PASSES AWAY IN BELLINGHAM

William McDonnell, age 46 years,
formerly a resident of Lynden, passed
away Friday at his home in Belling-
ham, after a lingering illness. Fu-
neral services were held Sunday at
the Lynden cemetery.

Mr. McDonnell was a member of
the Brotherhood of American Yeom-
en of Lynden and the Independent
Order of Foresters. Surviving him

age 6 years; his father, Thomas J.

ward and Ralph, of Streamstown, Al-
berta, Canada; and one brother, Har-
ry of Bellingham.

TOWNSHIP ASSESSORS TO USE NEW SCHEDULE FOR STOCK

An effort is being made this
month to bring the assessment of livestock
and poultry back to pre-war valua-
tions. Township assessors have each
received a copy of a suggested sched-
ule drawn up at a meeting of the
township officials of the county this
month, and it is this schedule that
the officials hope to see maintained.

The following are the township of-
ficers' resolutions, giving the sched-
ule:

"Be it resolved, that all property
subject to assessment for taxation
should be assessed therefor at its fair
cash market value.

"Resolved further, that livestock,
and poultry in Whatcom County were
assessed too high in 1920, and we
note with disapproval the attempt
being made to secure the assessment
of the same at war prices this year.

"It is the sense of this meeting
that the valuations of cattle for as-
sessment should range according to
the individual animal between the
following minimum and maximum
values:

"Yearlings, \$7 to \$15.00; stock
cattle (2 years) \$15.00 to \$30.00;
stock cattle (3 years and over) \$20
to \$40; milk cows, \$25 to \$50; milk
cows, grade dairy, \$30 to \$65; pure
bred cows, \$75 and up; bulls, \$40
and up; poultry, 50c to 75c a head."

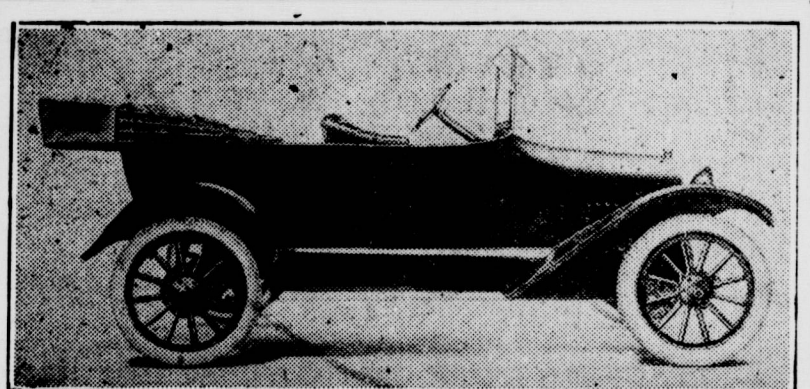
