

THE COMING HORSE

THREE CLASSES WHICH FARMERS WILL FIND IT PROFITABLE TO BREED.

The coming horse for the market should be large and smooth, writes George Cokeran in The Prairie Farmer. The farmer should breed for three classes—the draft, coach and roadster. The draft mare should be bred to a large, smooth, heavy built horse of some one of the draft breeds, but if you have a good, large coach mare bred to a smooth, stylish coach horse of good size and breed a road mare that has good size to a large coach or road horse. The mare should be bred so as to foal about the 1st of February or March or the last of September or 1st of October. When going into

the business of raising colts, it is necessary to have two or more large box stalls. The mare when near foaling time should run out during the day when the weather is pleasant and be

kept in the stall day and night when it is stormy. Keep the stall well bedded. After the colt comes, as soon as you can get hold of it do so and hold it until it quits struggling; then stroke it with the hand until it finds out you do not intend to hurt it. Have a snug fitting little halter to put on it and afterward, when you go in the stable, call it by names and caress it so as to make it feel that you are its friend. When you take the mare out of the stable to water, leave the colt in the stall, and it will soon learn that it cannot follow and will give you no more trouble in that way. After the colt is a few days old, if the mother's trough is too high for the colt to feed out of, nail up a little box for it. Feed the mare oats and bran before and after foaling unless the bowels seem too loose. If so, discontinue the bran. When feeding timothy hay, you will be likely to need the bran, but if clover hay is fed oats alone will be sufficient. When using the mare, always leave the colt at home, if possible; but, if not, take two hitching straps and fasten one to the colt's halter and tie the end of the strap to the mother's harness, giving the colt about three feet of strap; then take the other strap and fasten one end in the colt's halter and the other to the mare's singletree. Have a light buggy whip and touch it up when it will not go. The mare and colt should be fed regularly until the colt is 6 or 8 months old; then the colt should be left in its stall and fed the same as the work teams until it is 1 year old; then put on good pasture, and it will take care of itself. The second and third winter it can run to the straw and hay stacks and can take care of itself provided it has a good, dry shed to lie down in.

A correspondent of the Michigan Farmer submits a diagram of a stall that he used for ten years. "Fasten the chain about 3 1/2 feet above floor and 8 feet back from manger," says he. "Have a hook at one end, so you can open easily. Wire the other fast, that you may always have chain at hand. I never have had carpenter work to do behind horse tied in this stall."

A sort of cross between the small chink and the big, bony animal. He is tough and strong and capable of considerable speed. The breeders use a horse of something this type, but a little larger. For newspaper delivery and other heavy work the long eared, nervous animals are best—those that will start off almost on a run and keep it up for ten blocks. Very few cases of moon blindness are reported. Nearly all of the stables have a veterinarian in connection, and all such matters are submitted to him. In what is said above the horses meant are those having good care and plenty to eat. There are dozens of miserable, half starved old pligs that are made to do far more work than they are able. Now and then one has enough sense to balk for ten minutes or so and thus get a little rest.

Marketing Wool.

Thousands of dollars are annually lost by woolgrowers by reason of the slovenly manner in which the clips are sent to the market. Many a clip is discounted a full cent or more per pound on account of the bad condition in which it comes to the market, while nothing is gained by the seller either in saving of time or labor. A clean, well tied fleece always meets a warm welcome among buyers, sorters and millmen.—Sheep Breeder
