### Coal Company Elect Directors.

The first annual meeting of the stockholders of the Nicola Coal Mines, Limited, of which there are quite a number in Palouse, was held at the company's office in Spokane, Friday, March 20th, says the Palouse Republic. There being \$58,900 shares represented, the following directors were elected: J. A. Parkins, A. J. Davis, Colfax; Paul Bockmier, Palouse; F. E. Langford, L. M. Cornthwait, F. W. Harrington, Spokane; S. Andrew Hartman of Tacoma.

After the stockholder's meeting the directors immediately organized by electing A. J. Davis, president; L. M. Cornthwait, vice president and F. W. Harrington, secretary and treasurer. It was decided to place 100,000 shares of treasury stock on the market, Paul Bockmier of this place taking an option on the entire amount. All the private stock was pooled until October 1, 1903. Mr. Bockmier will leave for the Nicola Coal fields April 1, to inspect the property and to report at the next meeting of the directors.

There has been much stock in the Nicola Coal Mines, Limited, sold to Palouse parties during the past six months, and every indication points to it as being an excellent investment.

### An Opera House for Garfield

Garfield may have an opera house at a nominal cost, says the Garfield Enterprise. A. P. Johnson, manager of the Garfield Hardware and Mercantile company, offers to furnish the lot and to put the roof on the building gratis.

The proposition is fair and generous. It is this: Two estimates will be made; one of the cost of the building complete, to be erected by the company in connection with their present building; the other estimate to include the additional cost for a second story. Mr. Johnson proposes that the town may have the second story for the additional cost, which will be for the four walls and the finishing, the site and roof to cost the town absolutely nothing.

This building will be 50x100 feet, which will give a floor space ample for all purposes for a town hall or opera house. It is up to the citizens of Garfield to observe that this is one of those opportunities that passes.

### Profits Without Bookkeeping.

### Will Raise Peas.

A. J. Milton, representing Northrup & King, the great Minneapolis seed house, is in Palouse in an effort to interest the farmers in raising peas, which vegetable, according to information from the experiment station at the Washington Agricultural college, is a natural product of this soil, says the Palouse Republic. Mr. Milton's proposition is immensely fair and cannot result in any loss to the farmer. The Northrup & King company offers to furnish the seed free of cost to the producer and in the fall when the crop is harvested will pay a contract price of from \$2 to \$2.50 per hundred pounds, according to variety, the peas to be delivered at the nearest depot in sacks furnished by the seed house. Mr. Milton has been in Palouse for one week, and has made contracts with some twenty farmers. He says an average yield of peas is from 1500 to 1600 pounds per acre, and there is but little work connected with their production. It requires fifty pounds of seed per acre. The company has contracted for almost 2000 acres at different points in the Palouse country.
