Try This on the Squirrels. We were handed the following receipt, which is used most successfully in the prairie states in ridding the farm of gophers, says the Pullman Herald. It is thought that it would prove a success in dealing with the Palouse ground squirrel: "Bring one quart of vinegar to boiling, add one ounce of strychnine, stir with a stick until fully dissolved and then add six quarts of hot water. Pour this on 20 pounds of wheat or corn and allow to stand for about 18 hours, or until the solution is entirely absorbed, but the mass must be frequently stirred vigorously so that it will become uniformly saturated with the poison. The grain should now be spread out to dry, where it cannot be reached by animals or children, for you have a highly poisonous grain. Now dissolve six pounds of sugar in six quarts of water and boil until one gallon remains and then allow to cool. When cold add one tablespoonful of anise oil (can be had at any drug store). You now have a thick syrup which should be poured over the nearly dry poisoned grain and the whole stirred so as to cover each grain with a layer of syrup. Allow the grain to dry thoroughly, stirring so as to prevent its sticking in a mass. The odor of anise oil is very attractive to the gopher, and each kernel should contain enough poison to destroy one gopher. The sugar-coated grain can be used at any time, but great care should be taken to prevent any possible poisoning of birds or animals. A little of this grain buried near each gopher burrow will be pretty sure to attract and destroy its victim." A Bunion Cure. One way of curing a bunion is to bathe the afflicted part every night in hot water to which have been added a tablespoonful of starch, a teaspoonful of salt and half a teaspoonful of tincture of arica. After bathing the foot and wiping it dry with a soft, clean towel a small quantity of tincture of iodine should be applied with a camel's hair brush. A loose shoe should invariably be worn. Spanish Rice. Fry half a cup of rice in a little butter until it turns a light brown. Then pour on nearly a quart of boiling water and boil the rice until soft. Fry two large onions, four large tomatoes and three green peppers until soft. Add this to the boiled rice just before serving. Add salt if necessary and serve hot. A Wrinkle in Fancy Work. The tedious work of drawing threads in linen destined for hemstitching is rendered very much easier if the fabric is soaped beforehand. Make a dry lather and apply over the space with a shaving brush. When the linen is dry the threads may be easily pulled out. When frying smelts sprinkle with lemon juice before rolling in eggs and crumbs. It keeps the flesh white and gives it a good flavor. An Improvement. COLONEL YOUNGHUSBAND.

Career of the Officer Who is Invading Tibet.

The adventure of Colonel Younghusband into the strange and inaccessible country of Tibet is attracting a great deal of interest, and upon its outcome many important developments of the future may depend. The advance of the British under this officer requires no small degree of endurance and energy, but it is proving a costly expedition in point of both blood and treasure, and antiexpansionists in Great Britain do not withhold criticism of the enterprise.

The people of Tibet are a very fanatical and priest ridden people who are exceedingly jealous of any attempts to induce them to adopt modern ways of thinking and living, and innovators in

that country take their lives in their hands. The British would like to extend their trade in that direction and would also like to offset Russian influence and pave the way for the extension of the British empire across the Himalayas into this region. The announced intention of the expedition, however, was merely the enforcement of treaty agreements made by the Tibetans which the British claimed they had failed to carry out. It was maintained that Tibetans had violated the English frontier and that trade obligations had been ignored.

Colonel Francis Edward Younghusband, who is in command of the expedition, is a soldier who has a reputation for unusual bravery and is also an intrepid traveler and a clever writer. In 1886 he traveled through Manchuria and in the following year went from Peking to India by way of Turkestan. In 1886 he joined the Chitral expedition as a special correspondent and went to the Transvaal in a similar capacity. He has written several books.




