A DARING HOLDUP.

Robbers Sandbag Joseph Portz at Uniontown, Saturday.

Joseph Portz of Uniontown was the victim of a daring and vicious hold up Saturday night, when three masked men met him as he was going to his home in that city. Mr. Portz was struck on the head by a sand bag and relieved of \$180 in money, several checks and a gold watch. The robbers placed the point of a pistol in his face, compelled him to march to the railroad yards with them, where they put him in a refrigerator car and locked the door. He remained in the car about two hours before he was able to attract anyone's attention by his calls for help.

After his release a posse started in pursuit and rounded up three men under a warehouse, whom Mr. Portz identifies as the men who held him up. They were brought to the county jail Monday and gave the names of Tom Gleason, Albert Westfall and Robert Laurens. They are all hard looking characters and the articles found in their possession indicate that they are in the holdup business, although officers have been unable to locate any of the booty secured from Mr. Portz.

Robert H. Kipp acted for Prosecuting Attorney Hanna, who is absent from the county, and accumulated sufficient evidence to warrant him in filing an information direct in the superior court. The three men under arrest are hard looking persons and the sheriff is of the opinion that an important capture has been made. The prisoners are all young fellows, but their faces are those of hardened criminals. They will be arraigned before Judge Chadwick.
