stable of Precincts Nos. 44 and 52 was approved.

The application of George Shappart for a saloon license at the town of Winona, Wash., was granted and his bond approved.

The application of Lewis S. Park for a pool and billiard table license at Winona, Wash., was granted and his bond approved.

The petition of W. T. Peck for a pool table in Precinct No. 35 was rejected.

The surveyor's reports on the construction of the Allen and DeLong bridges were approved.

The certificate of the superintendent of schools transferring part of section 22, township 17 north, range 42 south of the Palouse river from district No. 130 and district No. 136.

The bid of A. Vaik for the building of the George Hill bridge across Four Mile for \$200 was accepted, and the bids of C. Kenoyer and J. W. Janney were rejected.

The board granted the Washington Water Power company a franchise to conduct electric power over the county roads of Whitman county and the bond of the company in the sum of \$5,000 to hold the county from any damages or claim for damages by reason of the construction of electric lines over Whitman county.

The proposition of the state to furnish Whitman county with convicts for labor on the county roads, was considered by the board and, after due consideration, they did not think that it would be to the best interests of the county at this time to accept the offer of the state, and for a further reason that in making their levy they did not take into consideration the extra amount of expense that would be necessary on account of the working of the prisoners and that there would not be a sufficient sum of money in the treasury at this time to pay the additional expense, therefore, the board declined to accept the offer made by the state.

Tax Matters.

The application of L. B. Shultz for the cancellation of taxes on certain tracts in Pullman was granted on account of double assessment.

The application of the O. R. & N. Ry. company for the cancellation of the taxes on a tract in section 32-17-44 for the years 1897 to 1904, on account of double assessment, was granted.

The application of J. D. Ellis for the cancellation of taxes on improvements on the east 17 1/2 feet of the south 84 feet of lot 10 block 12, Oakesdale, for the year 1904, on account of error in assessment, was granted.

The application of J. W. Rice for the cancellation of the taxes on one acre in the SW 1/4 of sec 10 15 44, for the years 1900 and 1901, on account of double assessment, was granted.

The application of M. W. Fockler for the cancellation of the taxes on the SW 1/4 of sec 20 17 44, for the years 1902 to 1905, on account of the same being government land, was granted.

Road Matters.

The county auditor was instructed to deposit with the clerk of the court the sum of \$829.00, the amount of the judgment granted. Fred Nager and wife in the establishment of the Jenkins road.

The auditor was also instructed to deposit with the county clerk \$55 00, the amount of the judgment against the county for the establishment of the old traveled Mays road.

The county surveyor was instructed to make an examination and survey of the proposed Marlett change in the Scholtz road, and to make a report of the same to the board.
